Subject: KSL Open House follow-up

Hello,

Please accept this written comment pertaining to the proposed KSL pipeline as a follow-up to the open house I attended in Burns Lake October 30, 2007.

I am a private land holder living at 11097 Bald Hill Road, directly south of Burns Lake. The proposed pipeline, once crossing Bald Hill Road in a westerly direction, will proceed through the property directly north of my own home.

I would appreciate your consideration in the following 3 areas:

1) Water Quality - My water source is from a well near the northern edge of my property, adjacent to the private land that the pipeline is proposed to pass through. I would request that I be reimbursed for regular water testing (1-2 times per year) to ensure that my water source is not negatively impacted. As well, I would request some assurance that should my water source be contaminated due to the development, that PTP would cover the costs of decontamination and/or developing a new source.

2) Access control - The area west of Bald Hill Road is a popular recreating area for snowmobilers and ATV users. The access, however, is currently restricted to one road near the end of Bald Hill Road. The pipeline would open up a new access point directly off Bald Hill Road, increasing recreational traffic in direct proximity to my home. Has access control been

considered off of Bald Hill Road?

3) Visual Quality - The proposed pipeline location will create a Right of Way directly up and over the summit of Bald Hill. Are there options to minimize the visual impacts of this development? Has another route been considered in a lower lying area?
