

PERMIT TO EXPORT

All Hunters (Resident or Non-Resident) in order to export game from the Province, must obtain a permit for this purpose from any Conservation Officer or Government Agent. This permit will be issued upon payment of the fees due as set forth in the regulations. Trophy fees are payable on any or all big game killed whether exported or otherwise.

BEAR MEAT

To prevent possible infection by Trichinosis, bear meat should not be consumed unless it is thoroughly cooked or adequately frozen for a period of time.

HUNTING SAFETY

It is recommended that hunters wear a blaze orange vest or other outer article of clothing when hunting big game and upland game birds. Hunters are reminded that they must clearly identify the species and sex of their target before shooting.


For detailed descriptions of areas closed to the discharge of firearms, hunters should contact the appropriate Regional Headquarters.

British Columbia HUNTING REGULATIONS SYNOPSIS 1973-1974



FISH AND WILDLIFE BRANCH Victoria



For the purpose of defining the open seasons for big game and game birds, the Province is divided into Management Areas (some-times referred to as M.A.'s) being B.C. Regs. 36/37 and 116/70. The open seasons for the hunting of each species of game

are shown in the tables on the following pages. All dates mentioned thereon are inclusive.

Where open seasons do not apply to the entire Management Areas they are marked by a colour tint and the applicable restrictions are mentioned on the page opposite to the table under the detailed regional map.

The open seasons declared by these Regulations shall cease to be in effect in any area covered by a closure order issued by the Forest Service of the Department of Lands, Forests and Water Resources and shall continue to be ineffective during the period covered by such forest closure order.

Unless otherwise indicated or amended, all dates in these Regu-lations apply to the period of July 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974. The abbreviation "TBA" means "to be announced".

HUNTING METHODS

Firearms. Specific restrictions on the use of firearms for a given Management Area are stated on the following pages under the detailed regional maps.

In addition the following general regulations apply:

The use of military (hardpoint), tracer, incendiary or explosive bullets for hunting game is prohibited.

The use of rimfire cartridges for hunting big game is prohibited. It is unlawful to hunt game birds with a rifle, except grouse and ptarmigan.

Shotguns may be used only for the hunting of deer, black bear, cougar, coyote, wolf, game birds and small game. A shotgun used for hunting deer must be 28 gauge or larger.

Hunters are reminded that the onus is on them to clearly

identify the species and sex of their target before shooting. Park restrictions. Hunting and/or the discharge of firearms is not permitted in any Provincial Class C Park nor in the majority of

Class A or B Parks. The following are only a few of the 100 Class A or B Parks where the use of firearms is prohibited: Bowron

Lakes Park, Champion Lakes Park, Cultus Lake Park, Golden Ears Park, Manning Park, Mount Seymour Park, Newcastle Island Park and Strathcona Park. A complete list of these Parks is available from: Parks Branch, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B.C.

These hunting regulations do not apply in any National Parks. Archery Hunting. Bow and arrow may be used for hunting all big game, small game and game birds with the following restrictions: No person shall hunt big game:

(a) With a bow having a pull less than 40 lbs. at a draw of 20 inches and an arrow other than one having a broadhead at least 7/a of an inch at the widest point.

(b) With a crossbow having a draw weight of less than 120 lbs. and a bolt (arrow) other than one having a broadhead of at least 7/8 of an inch at the widest point and a weight of not less than 500 grains.

No person shall hunt with a crossbow during the special bow and arrow seasons.

Shooting hours during which the hunting of game is permitted are in general from one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset. Exceptions are noted under the regional maps on the fol-

lowing pages and with the Migratory Game Bird Regulations. Baiting. Throughout the Province the hunting of Black Bear and Grizzly Bear by the placing of bait is prohibited. The Fish and Wildlife Branch does not condone the shooting of Grizzly Bears at or near garbage dumps.

Dogs. The use of dogs is permitted in the hunting of all game except Mountain Sheep, Mountain Goat and the Deer family. Exceptions to this rule are noted under the regional maps.

Note. Most Municipalities have local by-laws restricting or controlling the use of firearms within their boundaries. Consult Municipal Clerks and Regional Districts for details of closures.

Notice. It is unlawful to carry a loaded firearm in a vehicle. A loaded firearm is one containing live ammunition in the breech or magazine.

Point firearms at game only.

BAG LIMITS

Season bag limits for big and small game and daily bag limits for game birds for each Management Area are shown in the schedules on the following pages.

Where special restrictions exist as to species, sex or age, they are marked by a colour tint and the applicable restrictions are mentioned on the page opposite to the table under the detailed regional map.

Where no bag limit is in effect, the abbreviation NBL appears. An entry such as "2(1)" in the schedules means the bag limit

is two animals of that species in the aggregate, one of which may be antlerless.

SEASON BAG LIMITS

1. Subject to exceptions in the tables or below, the maximum number of each species of big game which a hunter may take in the Province in one licence year (the season bag limit) is one:

(a) Deer: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is two, except in M.A. No, 1 where a third deer may be taken and in M.A. No, 24 where there is no bag limit.

(b) Black Bear: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is two, except in M.A. No. 13, 14 and 15

where there is no bag limit. (c) Cougar: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is two in M.A. No. 1 to 8 inclusive and M.A. No. 12 to 19 inclusive.

(d) Wolf: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is three.

Subject to exceptions in the tables,

(a) the maximum number of Coyote, Raccoon, Skunk, Bobcat and Fox which a hunter may take in one licence year (the season bag limit) is: No bag limit.

(b) the maximum number of Wolverine and Lynx which a hunter may take in one licence year is one of each species.

GAME BIRDS:

No person while in the field either actually hunting or returning from hunting shall have in his possession game birds in excess of three times the daily limit. For possession limits on migratory game birds see regulations insert.

LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

ANY PERSON OF ANY AGE must take out a hunting licence if he hunts wildlife in British Columbia. There is no special fee for young people. In addition, a person under 18 must submit an acknowledgement of responsibility signed by a parent or guardian before obtaining a hunting licence. A person under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a person 20 or over when carrying a firearm.

NOTICE TO NON-RESIDENT BIG GAME HUNTERS

NON-RESIDENTS of the Province hunting big game must be accompanied by a licenced British Columbia guide. On the completion of the hunt non-residents must have a completed form of declaration. Failure to do so constitutes an offence on the part of both hunter and guide.

In Management Areas 16, 17, 18 and 19 hunting of Antlerless Mule Deer and Antlerless Moose by non-residents is not permitted.

TAG-LICENCE FEES

Big-Game Tag-Licences:

Persons hunting big game are required to take out the proper taglicences for the desired species before they start hunting.

Any person who kills any of the above big game species must immediately cancel the appropriate tag-licence.

The possession of a big game animal without a properly cancelled tag-licence is illegal.

Cancelled tag-licence means one from which the portions bearing the month and the day of the month have been removed, by the hunter, to indicate the date the animal was killed.

The cancelled tag-licence must accompany the carcass until

the carcass is at the place of consumption. ALL LICENCES EXPIRE MARCH 31. (Licences issued in March of any year expire March 31 of the following year.)

TROPHY FEES

All non-resident sportsmen are required to pay fees on any biggame animal they kill, whether or not the animal is taken from the hunting-ground.

The Fish and Wildlife Branch may in 1974 replace non-resident trophy lees with special non-resident big game lag-licences.

Deer. No open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer in the following areas of M.A.

(a) the watershed of the south fork of the Nanaimo River;

(b) that portion of the watershed of the Chemainus River lvina within the boundaries of the Mac-Millan Bloedel logging area (known locally as Copper Canyon) plus the watershed of Chipman (Boulder) Creek, and all lands between these two areas;

(c) that portion of the Gordon River watershed lying within the boundaries of the Western Forest Industries Ltd. logging area;

(d) the watershed of the White River;

(e) the watersheds of the Tsolum and Puntledge Rivers, and all lands lying between these watersheds, plus the watershed of Piggott Creek which is otherwise known as the south fork of the Oyster River.

The special Bow and Arrow only seasons for Mule (Blacktail) Deer Bucks are Aug. 25 to Sept. 7 and Dec. 3 to Dec. 9. Bear. The special Bow and Arrow only season for Black Bear is Aug. 25 to Sept. 7. There is no Spring

Bear Season in 1974.

Cougar. In that portion of M.A. 1 bounded to the South by the Mill Bay-Port Renfrew Road, and to the north by the northerly limit of the drainages of the Nitinat River, Cowichan River, and the Chemainus Rivers, the open season on Cougar is Dec. 1 to March 31. There is no open season on Cougar in that portion of M.A. No. 1 lying within the watersheds of the Big Qualicum and Nanaimo Rivers and all lands lying between these watersheds, with the exception of the watersheds of Haslam Creek and the south fork of the Nanaimo River.

Wolf. In that portion of M.A. No. 1 known as Cortes and Read Islands the open season on Wolves is April 1 to March 31.

Ptarmigan. No open season south of the Parksville-Alberni Highway (Highway 4),

Quail. The open season for California Quail is in that portion of M.A. No. 1 south of the 49th parallel of latitude only. There is no open season on Mountain Quail.

Canada Geese. Hunting prohibited in the Nimpkish Valley Canada Goose Study Area. Mayne Island. No open season for the hunting of wildlife.

FIREARM RESTRICTIONS/HUNTING METHODS

The use of rifles for hunting is prohibited in those portions of M.A. 1 known as: North and South Pender Islands, Salt Spring Island, Saturna Island, Galiano Island, Gabriola Island, Thetis Island, the Nanaimo Special Area, Happy Valley Area and Sidney Spit Marine Park area.

The use of rifles or shotguns with rifled slugs is prohibited in the Highland Land District.

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas of M.A. 1 known as: Glen Lake Closed Area, Florence Lake Closed Area, Brentwood Closed Area, Sooke Closed Area, Ganges Harbor Closed Area, Nanaimo Closed Area, Englishman River Closed Area, Protection Island and Mayne Island. The discharge of firearms is prohibited from Feb. 11 to Sept. 30 in the East Sooke Park Closed Area, and from Nov. 1 to June 30 in the Shoemaker Bay Closed Area.

In M.A. 1 deer may be hunted using shot shells provided they are SG, SSG or equivalent shot sizes. In M.A. 1 deer may be hunted with a dog provided the dog is on leash.




Wolf. In that portion of M.A. No. 1 known as Cortes and Read Islands, the bag limit for Wolf is three.


SPECIAL LICENCE REQUIREMENT FOR M.A. 1

SPECIAL LICENCE REQUIREMENT FOR M.A. 1 No person 14 years of age or over, whose place of residence is within Management Area No. 1 shall be issued a hunting or firearms licence unless: (1) (a) he is 14 years of age and possesses a certificate signifying that he has successfully completed a Conser-vation and Outdoor Recreation Education Program, or (b) he is 15 years of age or over and has been issued a valid British Columbia hunting or firearms licence subsequent to his 14th birthday, or he possesses a certificate, signifying that he has successfully completed the Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Education Program. (2) A person who resides within M.A. No. 1 and who is nineteen years of age or older at the time of application may be issued a firearms licence notwithstanding subsection (1) herein. NOTE: Persons under fourteen years of age may obtain a firearms or hunting licence, without taking a com-pulsory program, provided they comply with restrictions contained in the Criminal Code and other Provincial regulations.

Moose. In that portion of M.A. 2 east of the Fraser River and north of Highway No. 3 the open season on Bull Moose is from Sept. 8 to Sept. 16; no open season in the remainder of M.A. 2.

Mountain Goat. No open season in that portion of M.A. 2: south and east of the Fraser River; in the watershed of Cheekye Creek which is an easterly tributary of the Cheakamus River; on the east side of Howe Sound bounded on the west by Howe Sound, on the south by the northerly boundary of the West Vancouver District Municipality, and on the east and north by the height-of-land which separates the drainage systems of the Capilano, the headwaters of the Seymour, and the Stawamus Rivers from the easterly drainage systems of Howe Sound.

No open season on **Mountain Goats** in that portion of **M.A. 3** on Goat Island in Powell Lake, and in that portion of **M.A. No. 4** known as Mission Ridge, bounded on the south by Seton Lake and Seton Creek, on the east by the Fraser River, on the north and west by the Bridge River, and on the west by Mission Pass Road,

The open season on Mountain Goats is September 8 to October 21 in: that portion of M.A. No. 2 within the watersheds of the Squamish and Cheakamus Rivers (except Cheekye River-see above) and that portion of M.A. No. 2 bounded on the south and west by the Lillooet River and on the east by the Pemberton-D'Arcy Road.

Deer. In those portions of M.A. No. 3 known as Bowen and Keats Islands, there is no open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer. The special Bow and Arrow only season for Buck Mule (Blacktail) Deer in M.A. 3 is Dec. 3 to Dec. 9.

Pheasant. No open season in that portion of M.A. 2 lying east of the municipalities of Langley and Maple Ridge. The hunting of Pheasants in M.A. 2 is permitted from one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

FIREARM RESTRICTIONS/HUNTING METHODS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the followings areas of M.A. 2:

- (a) George C. Reifel Waterfowl Refuge.
- (b) Provincial Gaol Camp No. 1 (Chilliwack River Valley).
- (c) Serpentine Waterfowl Management Reserve.
- (d) Buntzen Lake Closed Area.

(e) Garibaldi Park (between Jan. 1 and August 31 of each year). Note: Hunting and/or discharge of firearms is not permitted in that portion of Garibaldi Park lying within the watersheds of Fitzsimmons Creek and Cheakamus River. (f) Pitt Polder between Feb. 1 and Aug. 31.

The use of rifles or shotguns with rifled slugs for hunting is prohibited in the following areas: (a) M.A. 2 Pitt Polder.

- (b) M.A. 3 Bowen and Keats Islands.

In M.A. 2 and 3 deer may be hunted using shot shells provided they are SG, SSG or equivalent shot sizes.

BAG LIMITS

Blue, Franklin and Ruffed Grouse. The daily aggregate for these three species in M.A. 2, 3 and 4 shall be ten (10) birds.



Moose. In those portions of M.A. 13 in the Adams River watershed upstream from Adams Lake and the North Thompson River watershed upstream from the confluence of the Clearwater and North Thompson Rivers, the season for Antlerless Moose is Oct. 20 to Dec. 2.

In that portion of M.A. 15 east of Highway 5, south of the Douglas Lake Road (292), and west of Highway 97, the season for Bull Moose is Sept. 15 to Nov. 18 and for Antlerless Moose is Nov. 10 to Nov. 18.

Deer. In that portion of M.A. 14 comprising the watershed of the North Thompson River the open season for Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) and Antlerless Whitetail Deer is Oct. 20 to Nov. 18.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. 14 east of the Bonaparte River and south of Bonaparte Lake there is no open season.

Mountain Goat. In those portions of M.A. 13 within the watersheds of the Momich and Raft Rivers, there is no open season.

Pheasant. In M.A. 13, 14 and 15 hunting permitted only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Quail. In M.A. 14 and 15 hunting permitted only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas;

(a) M.A. 13, 14 and 15: Kamloops Closed Area.
(b) M.A. 14: Tranquille Closed Area and McQueen Lake Closed Area. (c) M.A. 15: Salmon Arm Closed Area, Sicamous Closed Area and Minnie Lake Closed Area.

BAG LIMITS

Grouse (Blue, Franklin, Ruffed and Sharptail). Daily aggregate for these four species is 15 birds in M.A.'s 13, 14 and 15. The daily aggregate for Grouse (Blue, Franklin and Ruffed) shall be fifteen birds in M.A. 12.



The Fish & Wildlife Branch will be operating numerous Checking Stations throughout the Province. Hunters are required to stop at all stations and report.

Report any tagged bird or animal to the Fish & Wildlife Branch, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B.C. The Fish and Wildlife Branch may be introducing in 1974 a quota system for hunting certain wildlife species in parts of some M.A.'s.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. 6 west of Okanagan Lake and River, no open season on Mountain Sheep.

Deer. In M.A. 8 the open season for Buck Whitetail Deer is Sept. 25 to Oct. 28 and Nov. 10 to Nov. 18.

Mountain Goat. No open season in that portion of M.A. 5 within the watersheds of Kate Creek, Sitkum Creek and Outlet Creek, and no open season in that portion of M.A. 8 within the Lynch Creek and Morrell Creek watersheds.

Pheasant. In M.A. 5, 6, 7 and 8 hunting is permitted only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Hungarian Partridge. In M.A. 5, 6 and 7 hunting is permitted only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Quail. In M.A. 6 and 7 hunting is permitted only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS AND HUNTING METHODS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas: (a) M.A. 6: Kelowna Closed Area, Brenda Mines Closed Area, Swan Lake Closed Area and Skaha Lake Closed Area.

(b) M.A. 7: Similkameen Mining Co. Closed Area and the Upper Similkameen River Closed Area.

Monashee Park. The carrying of firearms of .22 calibre and the shooting of non-game animals within the boundaries of Monashee Provincial Park is prohibited.

Silver Star Park. Deer hunting only is permitted in Silver Star Park commencing Oct. 1, except in the vicinity of the ski hill, where the carrying of firearms is prohibited.

Dogs: In M.A. 5 deer may be hunted with a dog provided the dog is on leash.

BAG LIMITS

Blue, Franklin and Ruffed Grouse. The daily aggregate for these three species in M.A. 5, 6, 7 and 8 shall be ten birds.

UNIFORM DISTRESS SIGNAL


Any hunter in the field, in case of accident, distress, or otherwise, should as a signal, fire three shots allowing a space of five seconds between each shot and should anyone hear this signal, he should reply by firing one shot. DISTRESS SIGNAL to be given, if possible, until replied to. If, after a signal has been replied to the party is in need of assistance, he should repeat his first signal, but if not in need of assistance it will not be necessary to repeat signal.

Deer. There is no open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer and Antlerless Whitetail Deer:

(a) In that portion of M.A. 10 within the watershed of the Slocan River downstream from Slocan City.

(b) In that portion of M.A. 10 west of the Columbia River, south of Lower Arrow

Lake and east of the Canadian Pacific Railway Kettle Valley Line. In that portion of M.A. 11 within the watershed of the Kootenay River between the Fort Steele Bridge and the International Boundary, except the watershed of the Elk River above Morrisey, the open season on Antierless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is Nov. 3 to Nov. 5. In the remainder of M.A. 11 there is no open season.

Elk. In that portion of M.A. 10 within the watershed of the North Arm of Kootenay Lake (including all tributaries) north of the Balfour-Kootenay Bay ferry route plus that portion situated east of the South Arm of Kootenay Lake and Kootenay River (between Kootenay Bay and Rykerts) the open season on Bull Elk is Sept. 8 to Nov. 25 and on Antlerless Elk is Oct. 27 to Nov. 4. No open season in the remainder of M.A. 10.

In M.A. 11 the open season on Bull Elk is for males with branched antlers only.

The antiers of **Bull Elk** must accompany the tag-licence. **Moose.** In **M.A. 11** the open season on **Bull Moose** is for males with **branched** or **palmated antiers** only, the longer of which is longer than the ears or a minimum

of ten inches. The antlers of Bull Moose must accompany the tag-licence. Mountain Goat. In that portion of M.A. 9 within the watersheds of Waitabit and Marl Creeks, there is no open season.

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS AND HUNTING METHODS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas:

- (a) M.A. 9: Mica Creek Closed Area.
- M.A. 10: Kootenay Canal Development Closed Area. (b)

(c) M.A. 11: Fording Mountain Closed Area, Fording Coal Closed Area, Kaiser Resources Closed Area, Boivin Creek Closed Area, Wasa Slough, Moberly Marsh and Skookumchuk Pulp Mill Closed Area.

In M.A. 11 deer may be hunted using shot shells provided they are SG, SSG or equivalent shot sizes.

BAG LIMITS

M.A. 9, 10 and 11. The daily aggregate for Grouse (Blue, Franklin and Ruffed) is ten birds.



Deer, Buck Mule (Blacktail). September 8 to October 28. Deer, Antierless Mule (Blacktail). October 13 to October 19. The bag limit shall be one Mule (Blacktail) Deer of either sex and any age.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO NON-RESIDENT HUNTERS In M.A. 16, 17, 18 and 19 a non-resident of the Province shall not hunt Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer, or Antlerless Moose.

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in that portion of M.A. 17 known as Ocean Falls Closed Area.



The special Bow and Arrow only season for Bull Moose is Nov. 19 to Dec. 2 in that portion of M.A. 20 bounded on the south by the Buckhorn Road, on the east by the Willow River, on the northwest by the Fraser River from the mouth of the Willow River downstream to the Highway 97 Bridge, and on the west by Highway 97. Mountain Goats and Caribou. There is no open season in that portion of M.A. 20 described as follows: "commencing on the Fraser River at the mouth of the Holmes River, thence upstream on the Holmes River to its junction with Robson Park Boundary, thence south along the west side of Robson Park Boundary to its junction with the Fraser River, the point of with the Fraser River, thence downstream on the Fraser River to the point of commencement."

In that portion of M.A. 21 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude the open season for the following species is: Mountain Goat, Aug. 1 to Oct. 28; Mountain Sheep, 34 curl Rams only, Aug. 1 to Oct. 28; Grizzly Bear, Sept. 1 to Oct. 28; Ptarmigan, Aug. 1 to Nov. 18.

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

In Northern British Columbia, the discharge of firearms is prohibited within one-quarter mile of either side of the centre line of the following highways:
(a) Highway 16 from Prince Rupert to the B.C.-Alberta boundary.
(b) Highway 97 (including the Hart Highway) between Cottonwood River in the Cariboo District and Dawson Creek.
(c) Highway 37 from the Nass River Bridge to Stewart, and from Stewart to the B.C.-Yukon boundary.

BAG LIMITS

Grouse (Blue, Franklin and Ruffed). Daily aggregate for these three species shall be fifteen birds in M.A. 20, 21 and 22.

Deer (Mule or Whitetail). The season bag limit for deer in M.A. 20 is one of either species, either sex, any age.

the open season for the following species is: Bull Moose: Aug. 15 to Nov. 18; Antlerless Moose: Oct. 6 to Oct. 28; Bull Caribou: Aug. 1 to Nov. 25; Ptarmigan: Aug. 1 to Nov. 25; Mountain Goat: Aug. 1 to Oct. 28; Grizzly Bear: Sept. 1 to Oct. 28; Black Bear: Sept. 1 to Oct. 28.

Sept. 1 to Oct. 28. Mountain Goat: There is no open season on Mountain Goat in that portion of M.A. 25 described as follows: "bounded on the west by the Kitsumkalum River and Lake, the Cedar, Tseax and Nass Rivers; on the north by the Cranberry River; and on the east and south by Kit-wanga Lake, Kitwanga River and by the Nass River. Mountain Goat and Caribou: There is no open season for Mountain Goat or Caribou in that portion of M.A. 25 described as: "commencing

Mountain Goat and Caribou: There is no open season for Mountain Goat or Caribou in that portion of M.A. 25 described as: "commencing at the mouth of the Morice River; thence upstream on Morice River, Morice Lake and Atna Lake to the west end of Atna Lake; thence north to the junction of Kitsuns Creek and the Kitseguecla River; thence easterly to Smithers Landing; thence southerly to Topley Landing; thence southerly to the Bulkley River at Topley; thence down the Bulkley River to the point of commencement."

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

The **discharge of firearms** is prohibited in the following areas: (a) **M.A. 24**: Port Clements Closed Area.

M.A. 25: Kathlyn Lake Closed Area. (b)

(c) M.A. 26: Todagin Mt. Closed Area. In Northern British Columbia, the discharge of firearms is prohibited within one-quarter mile of either side of the centre line of the following

(a) Highway 16 from Prince Rupert to the B.C.-Alberta boundary.
(b) Highway 97 (including the Hart Highway) between Cottonwood
(c) River in the Cariboo District and Dawson Creek.

(c) Highway 37 from the Nass River Bridge to Stewart, and from Stewart to the B.C.-Yukon boundary.

BAG LIMITS

M.A. 23 and 25: The daily aggregate for Grouse (Blue, Franklin and Ruffed) shall be fifteen birds.

M.A. 26. The daily aggregate for Grouse (Blue, Franklin, Ruffed and Sharptail) shall be fifteen birds.

DEFINITIONS

RESIDENT means a person who is domiciled in the Province, and who has resided in the Province for the immediately preceding six (6) months.

GAME includes all big game, game birds and fur-bearing animals.

BIG GAME means any Mountain Sheep, Mountain Goat, Caribou, Elk, Moose, Deer, Grizzly Bear, Black Bear, Cougar or Wolf.

GAME BIRD means any Grouse, Part-ridge, Quail, Pheasant, Ptarmigan or migratory game bird.

SMALL GAME means certain fur-bearing animals namely Coyote, Fox, Racoon, Skunk, Wolverine, Bobcat and Lynx.

DEER FAMILY means Moose, Caribou, Deer and Elk

ANTLERLESS ANIMAL means a female or young animal of the year bearing no visible bony antlers. The small skin-or hair-covered protuberances on male fawns and calves do not constitute antlers. Such animals are antlerless for the purpose of these regulations. Over one year of age refers to a mem-ber of the deer family bearing visible antlers. ANTLERLESS ANIMAL means a female

MATURE RAM is an adult male moun-tain sheep which has attained the age of eight years as determined by the horn growth (annull); OR whose longest horn has grown through a minimum of $7_{\rm M}$ of a circle (315 de-grees) described by the outer surface of the horn as seen from the side and including any broomed portion.

34-CURL RAM is an adult male mountain sheep, whose longest horn tip has grown through ¾ of the circle (270 degrees) described by the outer sur-face of the horn, as seen from the side.

EVIDENCE OF SEX. During the males only season evidence of sex is re-quired on all members of the DEER FAMILY and MOUNTAIN SHEEP. Due to differential antierless seasons throughout the Province, hunters are urged, for their own protection, to leave adequate evidence of sex on all Big Game animals killed.

This can best be done by:

(a) leaving the head on the carcass; (b) in males, leaving a testicle or re-cognizable portion of the penis on the quarters:

in females, leaving a portion of the udder on the quarters

CANCELLED TAG - LICENCE means one from which the portions bearing the month and the day of the month have been removed, by the hunter, to indicate the date the animal was killed.

LICENCE YEAR means the period from April 1 to March 31 of the following year.

FIREARMS include any gun using, as a propellent: explosives, compressed air or gas and in addition, includes air or pellet guns and bows or crossbows

LOADED FIREARM means any firearm having live ammunition in the maga-zine or breech.

POWER BOAT means any boat, canoe or yacht powered by electric, gasoline, oil, steam or other mechanical means, but does not include a boat powered by an outboard motor which has been detached or removed from its operating position.



OPEN SEASONS

Elk. In that portion of M.A. 28 north of the Hart Highway (Highway 97) and north of Highway 2, no open season. Mountain Goat. In that portion of M.A. 27 within one

mile of either side of the Sikanni Chief River downstream from its confluence with Chicken Creek, no open season.

In that portion of M.A. 28 bounded on the south by the 55th parallel north latitude, on the west by the Sukunka River, on the east by the Murray River and on the north by the Pine River, no open season.

In that portion of M.A. 28 north of the Peace River, the open season for Mountain Goat is Aug. 1 to Oct. 28.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. 28 within one mile of the north shore of Williston Lake, no open season. In that portion of M.A. 28 north of the Peace River, the

open season for Mountain Sheep, Mature Rams only, is Aug. 1 to Oct. 28.

Muncho Lake Park. The hunting of game is prohibited in that portion of Muncho Lake Park lying between Mile Post 470 and 475 of the Alaska Highway (locally known as the Muncho Lake Sheep Licks).

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in that portion of M.A. 28 known as the Charlie Lake Closed Area.

In Northern British Columbia, the discharge of firearms is prohibited within one-quarter mile of either side of the centre line of the following highways:

(a) Highway 16 from Prince Rupert to the B.C.-Alberta boundary.

(b) Highway 97 (including the Hart Highway) between Cottonwood River in the Cariboo District and Dawson Creek

(c) Highway 37 from the Nass River Bridge to Stewart, and from Stewart to the B.C.-Yukon boundary.

BAG LIMITS

Grouse (Blue, Franklin, Ruffed and Sharptail). Daily aggregate for these four species is ten birds in M.A. 27 and 28.

Deer (Mule or Whitetail). The season bag limit for deer in M.A. 27 and 28 is one, of either species, either sex, and of any age.
