



For the purpose of defining the open seasons for big game and game birds, the Province is divided into Management Areas (sometimes referred to as M.A.'s) being B.C. Regs. 36, 67 and 116/70.

The open seasons for the hunting of each species of game are shown in the tables on the following pages. All dates mentioned thereon are inclusive.

Where open seasons do not apply to the entire Management Areas they are marked by a colour tint and the applicable restrictions are mentioned on the page opposite to the table under the detailed regional map.

The open seasons declared by these Regulations shall cease to be in effect in any area covered by a closure order issued by the Forest Service of the Department of Lands, Forests and Water Resources and shall continue to be ineffective during the period covered by such forest closure order.

Unless otherwise indicated or amended all dates in these Regulations apply to the period of July 1, 1974 to June 30, 1975.

Dates for Hunting Seasons may be changed by order of the Minister only in unusual conditions. Such changes will be given local publicity.

#### **HUNTING METHODS**

Firearms. Specific restrictions on the use of firearms for a given Management Area are stated on the following pages under the detailed regional maps.

In addition the following general regulations apply:

The use of military (hardpoint), tracer, incendiary or explosive bullets for hunting game is prohibited.

The use of rimfire cartridges for hunting big game is prohibited. It is unlawful to hunt game birds with a rifle, except grouse and ptarmigan.

Shotguns may be used only for the hunting of deer, black bear, cougar, coyote, wolf, game birds and small game.

A shotgun used for hunting deer must be 28 gauge or larger. Hunters are reminded that the onus is on them to clearly identify the species and sex of their target before shooting.

Park restrictions. Hunting and/or the discharge of firearms is not permitted in any Provincial Class C Park nor in the majority of Class A or B Parks. The following are only a few of the 100 Class A or B Parks where the use of firearms is prohibited: Bowron Lakes Park, Champion Lakes Park, Cultus Lake Park, Golden Ears Park, Manning Park, Mount Seymour Park, Newcastle Island Park, and Strathcona Park. A complete list of these Parks is available from: Parks Branch, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B.C.

These hunting regulations do not apply in any National Parks. Archery Hunting. Bow and arrow may be used for hunting all big game, small game and game birds with the following restrictions: No person shall hunt big game:

(a) With a bow having a pull less than 40 lbs. at a draw of 28 inches and an arrow other than one having a broadhead at least % of an inch at the widest point.

(b) With a crossbow having a draw weight of less than 120 lbs. and a bolt (arrow) other than one having a broadhead of at least % of an inch at the widest point and a weight of not less than 500 grains.

No person shall hunt with a crossbow during the special bow

and arrow seasons

Shooting hours during which the hunting of game is permitted are in general from one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset. Exceptions are noted under the regional maps on the following pages and with the Migratory Game Bird Regulations.

Baiting. Throughout the Province the hunting of Black Bear and Grizzly Bear by the placing of bait is prohibited. The Fish and Wildlife Branch does not conduce the checking of Grizzly Bear.

Wildlife Branch does not condone the shooting of Grizzly Bears at or near garbage dumps.

Dogs. The use of dogs is permitted in the hunting of all game except Mountain Sheep, Mountain Goat and the Deer family. Exceptions to this rule are noted under the regional maps,

Note. Most Municipalities have local by-laws restricting or controlling the use of firearms within their boundaries. Consult Municipal Clerks and Regional Districts for details of closures.

Notice. It is unlawful to carry a loaded firearm in a vehicle. A loaded firearm is one containing live ammunition in the breech or magazine.

Point firearms at game only.

#### BAG LIMITS

Season bag limits for big and small game and daily bag limits for game birds for each Management Area are shown in the schedules on the following pages.

Where special restrictions exist as to species, sex or age, they are marked by a colour tint and the applicable restrictions are mentioned on the page opposite to the table under the detailed regional map.

Where no bag limit is in effect, the abbreviation NBL appears. An entry such as "2(1)" in the schedules means the bag limit is two animals of that species in the aggregate, one of which may

# SEASON BAG LIMITS

1. Subject to exceptions in the tables or below, the maximum number of each species of big game which a hunter may take in the Province in one licence year (the season bag limit) is one:

(a) Deer: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is two, except in M.A. No. 1 where a third deer may be taken and in M.A. No. 24 where the bag limit is ten.

(b) Black Bear: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is two, except in M.A. No. 13, 14 and 15 where

there is no bag limit.
(c) Cougar: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is two in M.A. No. 2 to 4 inclusive and M.A. No.

(d) Wolf: The maximum number which a hunter may take in one licence year is three.

 Subject to exceptions in the tables,
 the maximum number of Coyote, Raccoon, Skunk, Bobcat and Fox which a hunter may take in one licence year (the season bag limit) is: No bag limit.

(b) the maximum number of Wolverine and Lynx which a hunter may take in one licence year is one of each species.

GAME BIRDS:

No person while in the field either actually hunting or returning from hunting shall have in his possession game birds in excess of three times the daily limit. For possession limits on migratory game birds see page 15.

# LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

ANY PERSON of ANY AGE must take out a hunting licence if he hunts wildlife in British Columbia. There is no special fee for young people. In addition, a person under 18 must submit ar acknowledgement of responsibility signed by a parent or guardian before obtaining a hunting licence. A person under the age of eighteen must be accompanied by a person 20 years old or over when carrying a firearm.

# NOTICE TO NON-RESIDENT BIG GAME HUNTERS

NON-RESIDENTS of British Columbia hunting big-game must be accompanied by a licenced British Columbia guide. On the completion of the hunt non-residents must obtain a completed form of declaration from their guide, failure to do so constitutes an

offence on the part of both hunter and guide.

Non-Residents are not permitted to hunt either Antlerless Mule

Deer or Antlerless Moose in Management Areas 16, 17, 18 and

19. Non-Residents are not permitted to hunt Grizzly Bear in Sub
units 3, 4 and 5 of Management Area 2, Management Subunits A, B, C, D, E, of Management Area 25; or Mountain Sheep

in Sub-unit 7D of Management Area 7.

Any person who kills any of the above big-game species must immediately cancel the appropriate species licence.

The possession of a big-game animal without a properly cancelled species licence is illegal.

Cancelled Species Licence means one from which the portions bearing the month and the day of the month have been removed, by the hunter, to indicate the day the animal was killed.

The cancelled species licence must accompany the whole or part of a big-game animal being shipped or transported.

All hunting and species licences expire March 31. (Licences

issued in March of any year shall expire March 31 of the following year.)

No open season within the watershed of the Tsitika River and on Mayne Island.

Deer M.A. 1:

(1) In the watershed of the south fork of the Nanaimo River, there is no open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer and Male Mule (Blacktail) Deer having less than two separate prongs on at least one antler, such prongs being at least two inches in length.

(2) No open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer in those portions of M.A. No. 1 des-

cribed as follows:

(a) that portion of the watershed of the Chemainus River lying within the boundaries of the MacMillan Bloedel logging area (known locally as Copper Canyon) plus the watershed of Chipman (Boulder) Creek, and all lands between these two areas:

49º N.

(b) that portion of the Gordon River watershed lying within the boundaries of the Western Forest

Industries Ltd. logging area; (c) the watershed of the White River;

(d) commencing at the outlet of the Oyster River, upstream to the boundary of Strathcona Park, thence southwards along the park boundary to the Puntledge River, thence down the Puntledge River to Fourbush Lake, Willemar Lake, Comox Lake and the Courtenay River, thence to the outlet of the Courtenay River, thence northwards along the coast to the point of commencement.

(3) The special bow and arrow only seasons on Mule (Blacktail) Deer Bucks are August 24 to

September 6 and December 2 to December 8.

Bear M.A. 1: The special bow and arrow only season on Black Bear is August 24 to September 6.

There is no Spring Bear Season in 1975.

Cougar. No open season on Cougar in that portion of M.A. No. 1 lying within the watersheds of the Big Qualicum and Nanaimo Rivers and all lands lying between these watersheds, with the exception of the watersheds of Haslam Creek and the south fork of the Nanaimo River.

Wolf. In that portion of M.A. No. 1 known as Cortes and Read Islands the open season on Wolves is

April 1 to March 31.

Quail. The open season for California Quail is in that portion of M.A. No. 1 south of the 49th parallel of latitude only. There is no open season on Mountain Quail.

Canada Geese M.A. 1: No open season on Canada Geese in the Canada Goose study area in the Nimpkish Valley.

# FIREARM RESTRICTIONS/HUNTING METHODS

The use of rifles for hunting is prohibited in those portions of M.A. 1 known as: North and South Pender Islands, Saltspring Island, Saturna Island, Galiano Island, Gabriola Island, Thetis Island, the Nanaimo Special Area, Happy Valley Area and Sidney Spit Marine Park area.

The use of rifles or shotguns with rifled slugs is prohibited in the Highland Land District.

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas of M.A. 1 known as: Glen Lake Closed Area, Florence Lake Closed Area, Brentwood Closed Area, Sooke Closed Area, Ganges Harbor Closed Area, Nanaimo Closed Area, Englishman River Closed Area, Protection Island Closed Area, Mayor Island Closed Area, Sooke Park Closed Area, Protection Island Closed Area, Protect Mayne Island Closed Area, and East Sooke Park Closed Area, and from Nov. 1 to June 30 in the Shoemaker Bay Closed Area.

In M.A. 1 deer may be hunted using shot shells provided they are SG, SSG or equivalent shot sizes.

In M.A. 1 deer may be hunted with a dog provided the dog is on leash.

Wolf M.A. 1: In that portion known as Cortes and Read Islands, the bag limit on wolf is three. Blue Grouse and Ruffed Grouse M.A. 1: The daily aggregate for these two species is six birds.

# SPECIAL LICENCE REQUIREMENT FOR MANAGEMENT AREAS (as of Sept. 1, 1974).

No person 14 years of age or over, whose place of residence is within the province of British Columbia shall be issued a hunting licence unless:

- (a) he possesses a certificate signifying that he has successfully completed a Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Education Program, or
- (b) he is over 14 years of age and has been issued a valid British Columbia hunting licence subsequent to his 14th birthday, or he possesses a certificate, signifying that he has successfully completed the Conservation and Outdoor Recreation Education Program.

NOTE: Persons under fourteen years of age may obtain a hunting licence, without taking a compulsory program, provided they comply with restrictions contained in the Criminal Code and other Provincial regulations.



Moose. In that portion of M.A. 2 east of the Fraser River and north of Highway No. 3 the open season on Bull Moose is from September 7 to September 15; no open season in the remainder of M.A. 2.

Mountain Goat. No open season in that portion of M.A. 2: south and east of the Fraser River; in the watershed of Cheekye Creek which is an easterly tributary of the Cheakamus River; on the east side of Howe Sound bounded on the west by Howe Sound, on the south by the northerly boundary of the West Vancouver District Municipality, and on the east and north by the height-of-land which separates the drainage systems of the Capilano, the headwaters of the Seymour, and the Stawamus Rivers from the easterly drainage systems of Howe Sound.

and the Stawamus Rivers from the easterly drainage systems of Howe Sound.

No open season on **Mountain Goats** in that portion of **M.A. 3** on Goat Island in Powell Lake, and in that portion of **M.A. No. 4** known as Mission Ridge, bounded on the south by Seton Lake and Seton Creek, on the east by the Fraser River, on the north and west by the Bridge River, and on the west by Mission Pass Road.

The open season on **Mountain Goats** is September 7 to October 20 in: that portion of **M.A. No. 2** within the watersheds of the Squamish and Cheakamus Rivers (except Cheekye River—see above) and that portion of **M.A. No. 2** bounded on the south and west by the Lillooet River and on the east by the Pemberton-D'Arcy Road.

Deer M.A. 3: (a) There is no open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer in the mainland portion north and west of Jervis Inlet and the watershed of Hunaechin Creek; (b) On Bowen Island, the special bow and arrow only season on Mule (Blacktail) Deer Bucks is September 7 to December 1 and on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is November 2 to November 24.

Grizzly Bear M.A. 3: There is a Limited Entry Hunting Season for residents, by draw only, on Grizzly bear in the North Coastal Area in the vicinity of Toba and Bute Inlets, from October 12 to November 10. There is no open season in the remainder of M.A. 3.

Pheasant. No open season in that portion of M.A. 2 lying east of the municipalities of Langley and Maple Ridge. The hunting of Pheasants in M.A. 2 is permitted from one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

Canada Geese M.A. 2: There is no open season on Canada Geese south of 49° 30' parallel of North latitude. (From the Canada-USA border to 30 miles north of the border.)

Note: There may be changes in the Regulations involving the municipalities of Richmond, Delta, Surrey and Langley during the 1974-75 Hunting Season.

(a) George C. Reifel Waterfowl Refuge.



Deer. In that portion of M.A. 14 comprising the watershed of the North Thompson River the open season for Antierless Mule (Blacktail) and Antierless Whitetail Deer is October 26 to November 24.

Moose. In those portions of M.A. 13 in the Adams River watershed upstream from Adams Lake and the North Thompson watershed upstream from the confluence of the Clearwater and North Thompson Rivers, the season for Antlerless Moose is October 26 to December 1.

In that portion of M.A. 14 comprising the watershed of Jamieson Creek there is No Open Season on Antierless Moose. Throughout the remainder of M.A. 14 the season on Antlerless Moose is October 26 to October 30.

In those portions of M.A. 15 comprising the South Thompson -Shuswap River watershed East of Highway #5 and the Nicola River watershed north of the Douglas Lake Road (292) and east of Highway #5, there is No Open Season on Antierless Moose. Throughout the remainder of M.A. 15 the season on Antierless Moose is October 26 to October 30.

Mountain Goat. In those portions of M.A. 13 within the watersheds

of the Momich and Raft Rivers, there is No Open Season.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. 14 east of the Bonaparte River and south of Bonaparte Lake there is No Open Season.

Grizzly Bear. There will be No 1975 Spring Season on Grizzly Bear in M.A.'s 12, 13, 14 and 15.

Pheasant: In M.A. 13, 14 and 15 hunting permitted only from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Quail: There is No Open Season in M.A.'s 12, 13, 14 and 15.

#### FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas:

(a) M.A. 13, 14 and 15: Kamloops Closed Area.
(b) M.A. 14: Tranquille Closed Area and McQueen Lake Closed

(c) M.A. 15: Logan Lake Closed Area, Minnie Lake Closed Area, Salmon Arm Closed Area and Sicamous Closed Area.

In M.A. 12, 13, 14 and 15 deer may be hunted using shot shells provided they are SG, SSG or equivalent shot sizes.



Deer M.A. 8: (a) In that portion north of Provincial Highway No. 6, the open season on Whitetail Deer Bucks and on Mule Deer Bucks is September 14 to December 1; (b) In that portion south of Provincial Highway No. 6 the open season on Whitetail Deer Bucks is September 14 to October 27 and November 9 to November 17, and on Mule Deer Bucks is September 14 to November 17.

Mountain Goat. No open season in that portion of M.A. 5 within the watersheds of Kate Creek, Sitkum Creek and Outlet Creek, and no open season in that portion of M.A. 8 within the Lynch Creek and Morrell Creek watersheds.

Mountain Sheep M.A. 6: There is no open season on Mountain Sheep in that portion west of Okanagan Lake and Okanagan River.

Mountain Sheep M.A. 7: There is a Limited Entry Hunting Season, described in B.C. Regulation 262/74, on **Mountain Sheep** within the general area of the Ashnola River watershed.

Black bear. There is no closed season on Black bear in M.A.'s 6, 7 and 8.

Pheasant. In M.A. 5, 6 and 7 hunting is permitted only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Hungarian Partridge. In M.A. 5, 6 and 7 hunting is permitted only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Quail. In M.A. 6 and 7 hunting is permitted only from 8 a.m. to

# FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS AND HUNTING METHODS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas: (a) M.A. 6: Kelowna Closed Area, Brenda Mines Closed Area, Swan Lake Closed Area and Skaha Lake Closed Area.

(b) M.A. 7: Similkameen Mining Co. Closed Area.
(c) Within One Quarter Mile of either side of the centre line on Highway 3 from the east boundary of Manning Park along to the west boundary of the village of Princeton.

Monashee Park: The carrying or possession of firearms within the boundaries of Monashee Provincial Park is prohibited, except from September 15 to December 31 inclusively.

Dogs: In M.A. 5 deer may be hunted with a dog provided the dog is on leash.



Deer M.A. 10: There is no open season on Antierless Mule (Blacktail) Deer and Antlerless Whitetail Deer: (1) within the watershed of the Slocan River downstream from Slocan City; (2) within the area west of the Columbia River, south of Lower Arrow Lake and east of the Canadian Pacific Kettle Valley Line.

Deer M.A. 11: Within the watershed of the Kootenay River between the Fort Steele Highway 93/95 bridge and the International Boundary, except the watershed of the Elk River above Morrissey, the open season on Antierless Mule (Blacktail) Deer and Antierless Whitetail Deer is November 2 to November 4. In the remainder of M.A. 11 there is no open season.

Moose M.A. 11: The open season on Bull Moose is for males with at least one branched or palmated antler, the longer of which is longer than the ears or a minimum of ten inches. The antlers of Bull Moose must accompany the tag-licence.

Elk M.A. 10: (1) within the watershed of Kootenay Lake and River upstream from the confluence of the Slocan River and the Kootenay River the open season on Bull Elk is September 7 to November 17, and on Antierless Elk is October 26 to November 3; (2) Within the northerly watershed of Lower Arrow Lake between Syringa Creek and the east boundary of Robson, the open season on **Elk** of either sex is September 7 to September 15. **Note:** Extensions of this season may be announced. (3) There is no open season on Elk of either sex in the remainder of M.A. 10.

Elk M.A. 11: The open season on Bull Elk is for males with at least one branched antler. For the purposes of this regulation a single (spike) antler with a brow tine is not a branched antler. The antlers of **Bull Elk** must accompany the species-

Mountain Goat M.A. 9: There is no open season on Mountain Goat in that portion within the watersheds of Waitabit and Marl Creeks.


Mountain Sheep M.A. 11: The open season on Bighorn Rams is for Mature Males only. The skull and horns of bighorn rams must accompany the species-licence.

Pheasants M.A. 10: Within the boundaries of the Duck Lake, Creston, Reclamation and Nick's Island Dyking Districts, except posted land and the rights-of-way of Highway No. 3 and public roads bounded on both sides by posted land, the season on Cock Pheasants is every Saturday, Sunday, Wednesday and Thursday from October 19 to November 10; between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. local time daily. In the remainder of M.A. 10, there is no open season. Daily or six-day permission forms must be purchased prior to hunting pheasants within the four Dyking Districts. There is a limit of six daily permission forms or one six-day permission form



Antiered Deer and Antiered Moose M.A. 21: The special Long Bow and Arrow only season on Antiered Deer and Antiered Moose is September 1 to September 14 in that portion described as follows: Commencing at the south-westerly corner of Lot 2432, Cariboo Land District; thence along Highway 97 to the Salmon River; thence upstream following the Salmon River to the southerly boundary of Lot 2529; thence southerly along North Kelly Road to the point of commencement.


Antierless Deer and Antierless Moose M.A. 20: There is no open season on Antierless Deer and Antierless Moose in that portion described as follows: Bounded on the east by the Willow River to its confluence with the Fraser River, on the west by the Fraser River to Hixon Creek, on the south by Hixon and George Creeks to the latter's confluence with the Willow River.

#### Antierless Deer and Antierless Moose M.A. 22:

(1) There is no open season on Antierless Deer and Antierless Moose in that portion described as follows: Bounded on the north by the Salmon River, Nukko and Crocker Creeks, northerly shores of Clauminchil, upper Clauminchil, and Steele Lakes and Chinohchey Creek, to the Stuart River. On the west by the Stuart and the Nechako Rivers, Cluculz, and Dahl Creeks, and westerly shores of Cluculz Lake, on the south and south-west by Dahl Creek, southerly shores of Norman and Dahl Lakes, the Chilake River to Checkieshie Creek, sleep the Checkieshie Lakes Dahl Lakes, the Chilako River to Chechischic Creek, along the Chechischic, Leigh, and Woodpecker Creeks to the Fraser River, thence on the east by the Fraser 10 River to the Salmon River.

Mountain Goat M.A.'s 22 and 25: There is no open season on Mountain Goat in those portions which comprise that area described as follows: Commencing at the confluence of Buck Creek and the Bulkley River; thence up Buck Creek to Goosly Lake; along north shore of Goosly Lake to Parrott Creek; along Parrott Creek to Francois Lake; along northerly shore of Francois Lake to Allin Creek; up Allin Creek to headwaters of Maxan Creek; down Maxan Creek and along westerly shores of Maxan Lake to Bulkley Lake; then northerly to the Bulkley River and the point of commencement,

Mountain Goat M.A. 25: There is a Limited Entry Hunting Season for residents, by draw only, on Mountain Goat in that portion described in B.C. Regulation 262 of 1974: Bounded on the west by the Kitsumkalum River and Lake, the Cedar, Tseax and Nass Rivers; on the north by the Cranberry River; and on the east and south by Kitwanga Lake, Kitwanga River and by the Skeena River.

Mountain Goat and Caribou M.A. 25: There is no open season on Mountain Goat or Caribou in that portion described as: Commencing at the mouth of the Morice River; thence upstream on Morice River, Morice Lake and Atna Lake to the west end of Atna Lake; thence north to the junction of Kitsuns Creek and the Kitseguecla River; thence easterly to Smithers Landing; thence southerly to Topley Landing; thence southerly to the Bulkley River at Topley; thence down the Bulkley River to the point of commencement.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

B.C. RESIDENT means a person who resides in the Province, and who has resided in the Province for the immediately preceding six (6) months prior to any application under the Wildlife

GAME includes all big game, game birds and fur-bearing animals.

BIG GAME means any Mountain Sheep, Mountain Goat, Caribou, Elk, Moose, Deer, Grizzly Bear, Black Bear, Cougar or Wolf.

GAME BIRD means any Grouse, Part-ridge, Quail, Pheasant, Ptarmigan or migratory game bird.

SMALL GAME means certain fur-bearing animals namely Coyote, Fox, Racoon, Skunk, Wolverine, Bobcat and Lynx.

DEER FAMILY means Moose, Caribou, Deer and Elk

BUCKS and BULLS mean males of the Deer family over one (1) year old.

ANTLERLESS ANIMAL means a female ANTLERLESS ANIMAL means a female or young animal of the year bearing no visible bony antiers. The small skinor hair-covered protuberances on male fawns and calves do not constitute antiers. Such animals are antierless for the purpose of these regulations. Over one year of age refers to a member of the deer family bearing visible

antlers.

MATURE RAM is an adult male mountain sheep which has attained the age of eight years as determined by the horn growth (annuli); OR whose longest horn has grown through a minimum of % of a circle (315 degrees) described by the outer surface of the horn as seen from the side and including any broomed portion.

TA-CURL HAM is an adult male mountain sheep, whose longest horn tip has grown through 3/4 of the circle (270 degrees) described by the outer surface of the horn, as seen from the side. 3/4-CURL RAM is an adult male moun-

EVIDENCE OF SEX. During the males only season evidence of sex is required on all members of the DEER FAMILY and MOUNTAIN SHEEP. Due to differential antierless seasons throughout the Province, hunters are urged, for their own protection, to leave adequate evidence of sex on all Big Game animals killed. This can best be done by:

(a) leaving the head on the carcass;

(b) in males, leaving a testicle or recognizable portion of the penis on the quarters; EVIDENCE OF SEX. During the males

quarters; (c) in females, leaving a portion of the udder on the quarters.

CANCELLED SPECIES LICENCE means one from which the portions bearing the month and the day of the month have been removed, by the hunter, to indicate the date the animal killed


LICENCE YEAR means the period from April 1 to March 31 of the following

FIREARMS include any gun using, as a propellent: explosives, compressed air or gas and in addition, includes gir or pellet guns and bows or cross-

LOADED FIREARM means any firearm having live ammunition in the maga-zine or breech.

zine or breech.

POWER BOAT means any boat, canoe or yacht powered by electric, gasoline, oil, steam or other mechanical means, but does not include a boat powered by an outboard motor which has been detached or removed from its operating position.



#### **OPEN SEASONS**

Elk. In that portion of M.A. 28 north of the Hart Highway (Highway 97) and north of Highway 2, no open season.

Mountain Goat. In that portion of M.A. 27 within one

mile of either side of the Sikanni Chief River downstream from its confluence with Chicken Creek, no open season.

In that portion of M.A. 28 bounded on the south by the 55th parallel north latitude, on the west by Sukunka River, on the east by the Murray River and on the north by the Pine River, no open season.

In that portion of M.A. 28 north of the Peace River, the open season for Mountain Goat is Aug. 1 to Oct. 27.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. 28 within one

mile of the north shore of Williston Lake, no open season.
In that portion of M.A. 28 north of the Peace River, the

open season for Mountain Sheep, Mature Rams only, is Aug. 1 to Oct. 27. Muncho Lake Park. The hunting of game is prohibited in that portion of Muncho Lake Park lying between Mile Post 470 and 475 of the Alaska Highway (locally known

as the Muncho Lake Sheep Licks).

## FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas:

(a) M.A. 28: Charlie Lake Closed Area and the Portage Mountain-Peace River Dam Closed Area.

The discharge of firearms is also prohibited within one quarter mile of either side of the centre line of the following highways:

(a) Highway 37 from the Nass River Bridge to Stewart, and from Stewart to the B.C.-Yukon boundary,

(b) Highway 97 (including the Hart Highway) between Cottonwood River in the Cariboo District and Dawson Creek

#### BAG LIMITS

Deer (Mule and Whitetail) M.A.'s 26, 27 and 28: The bag limit for deer is one, of either species, male only, and of any age

Grouse (Blue, Franklin, Ruffed and Sharptail) (M.A.'s 27 and 28: The daily aggregate for these four species is ten birds.

The use of snowmobiles in hunting is prohibited in M.A.'s 9, 10 and 11.

Deer M.A. 10 and 11: The bag limit for Deer (Mule and Whitetail) is two in the aggregate. Both may be Antierless Deer providing one is from each species.

Moose and Elk M.A. 9, 10 and 11: The bag limit on Moose and Elk is one of either species in the aggregate.

Cougar M.A. 9, 10 and 11: The bag limit on Cougar is one. Grouse (Blue, Franklin and Ruffed) M.A. 9, 10 and 11: The daily aggregate for these three species is ten birds.

Pheasant Cocks M.A. 10: The bag limit for cocks of this species

is twelve birds in the season.

Note: Limited Entry Hunting Seasons on Mountain Goat and Antlerless Elk may be instituted in Region V in 1975.

The discharge of firearms is prohibited within one quarter mile of either side of the centre line of the following highways: (a) Highway 16 from Prince Rupert to the B.C.-Alberta Boundary; (b) Highway 97 (including the Hart Highway) between Cottonwood River in the Cariboo District and Dawson Creek.

#### BAG LIMITS

Deer (Mule or Whitetail M.A. 20: The bag limit for deer is one of either species, either sex, any age.

Grouse (Blue, Franklin and Ruffed) M.A.'s 20, 21 and 22: The daily aggregate for these three species is fifteen birds.

daily aggregate for these four species shall be fifteen birds. Deer (Mule and Whitetail) M.A.'s 26, 27 and 28: The bag limit for deer is one of either species, bucks only.

# FISH & WILDLIFE VIOLATIONS

The unethical hunter is a threat to both wildlife and the hunting recreation. Regulations are set for the protection of wildlife populations, and those who violate these regulations damage the wildlife resources of our province. The first result is a loss of game to the legitimate hunter. But other wildlife users suffer as well, and often tend to blame all hunters for the actions of a few. In this way, the unethical hunter can damage the public image of hunting, resulting in a loss as well of hunting opportunities.

tunities. The Conservation Officer is responsible for the enforcement of Wildlife Regulations, but the job is an enormous one. British Columbia is a large and rugged province, and many hunting activities take place in remote areas. This means that offences may be committed, and damage done, without the offenders always being apprehended. When this happens, both wildlife and the sport of hunting suffer the consequences. An important goal of enforcement is the prevention of violations before the damage is done. This is where you can help. The watchful eyes of sportsmen throughout the province can provide a strong deterrent to potential violators and stop wildlife offences before they happen.

What can you do?

# Observe, Record, Report

Remember: Do NOT confront a suspected violator. You cannot make a "citizens arrest" or seize private property as evidence. Only a Conservation Officer or a constable is legally authorized to do this. Instead:

#### Observe:

To be aware of an offence taking place, you must familiarize yourself with current regulations. Some common violations are:

1) Killing game during a closed season.

2) Killing female or young animals during a male only season.

3) Exceeding the daily bag limit of game, game birds or game fish.

4) Angling in closed areas.
5) Property damage (shooting powerline insulators, roadsigns, industrial equipment).
6) Night hunting or pitlamping.
Details may be found in the Hunting Regulations synopsis published each year.

#### Record:

Record:
Carry a pencil and record your observations in note form as soon as you can. Photographs provide an extremely useful addition to these observations if they can be taken without alarming the violator. Take note of any features that will be of use to the enforcement officer in his investigation. These include:


1) Time, date, location and weather conditions.
2) Identity of violator or accurate description (size, clothing, hair colour, etc.).
3) Identity or description of companions.
4) Vehicle licence and description.
5) Evidence at the scene (head or viscera of animal, empty cartridges, etc.).
6) Actions of the violator(s) (number of shots, etc.).

Your observations as soon as possible to the nearest Conservation Officer or to police. The longer you wait, the more difficult it will be to investigate the violation.

Always give your name, address and local phone to verify that your intentions are serious.

**British Columbia Migratory Birds** HUNTING REGULATIONS SYNOPSIS 1974-1975



#### LICENCES

When hunting or transporting migratory game birds, you must have on your person a valid Canada Migratory Game Bird Hunting Permit in addition to any required provincial hunting licence.

The permit is available at the Post Office for \$2.

#### EQUIPMENT

- No person shall hunt using: a shotgun of any kind capable of holding more than three shells in the magazine and chamber combined; a rifle or shotgun loaded with a single bullet; or any weapon other than a long bow and arrow or a shotgun not larger than number 10 gauge.
- No person shall have with him, for his own use, more than one shotgun, unless each shotgun in excess of one is disassembled or unloaded and cased.
- No person shall shoot from any aircraft, sailboat, power boat, or motorized vehicle, or any vehicle to which a draught animal
- No person shall use a boat, aircraft, or motor vehicle to disturb birds with the object of driving them towards a hunter.
- No person shall use live birds as decoys, or recorded bird calls.

#### TIME

- No person shall hunt at any time throughout the year except during the open season as described in the schedule.
- · No person shall continue to hunt on any day on which he has taken his daily bag limit.
- No person shall hunt earlier than one-half hour before sunrise or later than one-half hour after sunset.

#### PLACE

 No person shall hunt within one quarter mile of any area baited with grain or other food.

#### RETRIEVAL

- It is permitted to retrieve a dead or injured migratory game bird by the use of a power boat provided that person is not in possession of a loaded firearm.
- · No person shall kill, cripple or wound a migratory game bird without making all reasonable efforts to retrieve it and include it in his daily bag limit. The retrieved bird shall be killed immediately and included in the hunter's daily bag limit.

#### POSSESSION AND TRANSPORT

- No person shall possess or transport a migratory game bird unless at least one wing and the plumage thereof remains attached to the bird. Such a wing and plumage may be
- a. when the bird is prepared for immediate cooking, or
- b. after the bird is taken to the residence of the owner for preservation.

#### EGGS AND NESTS

· No person shall take, injure, or destroy the eggs or nests of migratory birds at any time.

- No person shall buy or sell migratory birds or their eggs or
- No person shall waste or wantonly dispose of a migratory game bird killed or retrieved by him or in his possession.

#### PENALTY

Every person who violates any provision of the Migratory Birds Convention Act or any regulation shall, for each offence, be liable upon summary conviction to a fine of not more than \$300, and not less than \$10, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or to both fine and imprisonment.
