


Figure 15. Triumph River 5.0 km upstream from mouth, above lower falls.




Figure 18. Triumph River 1 km from Estuary. This was a major adult steelhead holding area.




Figure 19. Middle section of Triumph River.




Figure 23. Second piece of holding water below upper rapids.




Figure 25. First good piece of holding water below upper rapids.
