A prospector as defined under the "Game Act" is as follows:—

"Prospector' means a person who is the holder of a free miner's certificate under the 'Mineral Act' or the 'Placer-mining Act' and only while he is actually engaged personally in placer-mining or prospecting."

Any bons-file prospector who is the holder of any licence to carry firearms under section 34 of the "Game Act" may during the open or close season in any unorvanized district as defined above hunt and kill and retain in his passession any game for his own use when in actual need of the same for food.

Any bons-file prospector in an organized district as defined above may bunt and kill and retain in his possession any game during the same season when in actual need of the same for food, and in an organized district during the close season bunt and kill and retain in his possession any animals of the deer family, other than wapiti, of the male sex over ore year of arc, after having obtained a permit therefor.


