118 HONOUR the Heatmant Governor in the Founcil has been placed to order that under the provisions of the "Game Art," chap-ter 168 of the "Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1936," the following Game Regula-tions be made for the year 1942-43:

Any bona-fide prospector who is the holder of any licence to carry frearms under section 31 of the "Game Act" may during the open or close season in any unorganized district as defined above hunt and kill and retain in his possession any rame for his own use when in actual need of the same for food.



(1.) Do not overtrap; conserve the furthearing animals on your trap-line.

Please make your application for renewal of your replaced time and your recurs of each encourage the past season's operations after the expiration of your Special Finearis Licence, or at least before October dist, as failure to renew or submit your return of each may place your application for registered tration in line for concellation.
