THE HUNTER'S... The Lieutenant Governor in Council has been pleased to order that under the provisions of the Game Act, chapter 10 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1928, the following Game Regulations be made for the year 1944, and that all other regulations and orders in force under the said Act be amended as follows:

GAME REGULATIONS, 1944

1. The prohibitions declared by section 18 of the "Game Act," being chapter 10 of the "Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1928," as to the hunting, trapping, taking, possession, and killing of game, are subject to the provisions of sections 2 to 8, and the regulations, hereby removed to the extent and within the period and limits and subject to the provisions hereinafter set out respectively, as follows:

For the purpose of defining the open seasons for big game, game birds, and trapping of fur-bearing animals, the Province shall be divided into two districts, to be known as the Western and Eastern Districts.

"WESTERN DISTRICT" shall mean and include all that portion of the Province situated and lying to the west of the summit of the Cascade Mountains and south of the Electoral District of Athol, except that portion of the Electoral District of Skeena covered by the watershed of the Lakelse and Skeena Rivers.

"EASTERN DISTRICT" shall mean and include all of the remainder of the Province.

Provided for the purpose of the open seasons on migratory birds that in the Electoral District of Lillooet situated and lying to the east of a line drawn north and south (astronomically) of Alta Lake railway station on the Pacific Coast Railway and that portion of the Skeena River and the watershed of the Skeena River and the boundaries of the Electoral District of Skeena east of a line drawn north and south (astronomically) through the mouth of Sotha River be considered and considered as lying within the Eastern District.

EASTERN DISTRICT (OPEN SEASONS).

BIG GAME.

(a) BEAR (except White or Kermodei Bear), in the Eastern District, open season on Grizzly Bear, from September 1, 1944, to September 30th, 1945, and on Black or Brown Bear there shall be no close season.

Provided that no Bear shall be trapped in the Eastern District.

(b) CARIBOU, of the male sex, over one year of age, in the Eastern District (except the Mackenzie and Cariboo Electoral Districts and that further portion of the Eastern District situated and lying to the south of the main line of the Canadian National Railway), open season from September 1st, 1944, to November 15th, 1944.

In the Eastern District situated and lying to the south of the main line of the Canadian National Railway and the watershed of the Loo Electoral District situated and lying to the east of the Fraser River, open season from September 1st, 1944, to October 31st, 1944.

(c) DEER (Mule, White-tail, and Coast), BUCKS ONLY, of the male sex, over one year of age, in the Eastern District (except the Eastern District situated and lying to the north and south of the Skeena River, and the Skeena, Nelson-Creston, and South Okanagan Electoral Districts), open season from September 15th, 1944, to December 15th, 1944.

DEER (White-tail only), DOES, over one year of age, in the Nelson-Creston, Cranbrook, Fernie, and Columbia Electoral Districts, open season from September 1st, 1944, to September 14th, 1944.

DEER (Mule only), DOES, over one year of age, in that portion of the Columbia Electoral District situated and lying a distance of not more than five (5) miles on either side of the main highway lying south of a straight line drawn due east and west and passing through Spilliamcheen Post-office, open season from September 1st, 1944, to September 14th, 1944.

Provided that there shall be no open season on any member of the deer family in those portions of the Eastern District described as follows:

In that portion of the Fernie Electoral District as follows: Commencing at the junction of Morrissey Creek and Elk River; thence easterly following the summit of the Adams River and Garnet Creek, both flowing into the north end of Adams Lake, open season from October 14th, 1944, to October 22nd, 1944.

In those portions of the Similkameen and South Okanagan Electoral Districts situated and lying to the east of Okanagan Lake and Sotha Creek; thence northerly following the summit of the said watershed and westerly along the summit on the north side of said creek and Meadow Creek, open season from October 14th, 1944, to October 31st, 1944.

FUR-BEARING ANIMALS.

(A) BEAVER, MUSKRATS, and OTTER (except Season), in that portion of the Eastern District situated and lying to the north of the 53rd parallel of north latitude and in the Yale and Kamloops Electoral Districts, open season from March 1st, 1945, to May 15th, 1945; provided that in the Lillooet and Creston Electoral Districts, Otter may be trapped from November 1st, 1944, to May 15th, 1945.

In the remainder of the Eastern District, open season from March 1st, 1945, to April 30th, 1945.

ALL OTHER FUR-BEARING ANIMALS (except Badger) throughout the Eastern District, open season from November 1st, 1944, to February 28th, 1945.

NOTE: Skunks are included in the definition of fur-bearing animals.

MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS.

(A) DUCKS (except Wood and Elder Ducks), GOOSE, GEESE, in the Eastern District (except the Peace River Electoral District); thence northerly to the mouth of Whopaw Creek between the Hope-Princeton Road and the Similkameen and Sotha Rivers and Columbia River, to the Columbia River, thence the Three Forks Salmon Arm, North and South Okanagan, and that portion of the Electoral District of South Kamloops and the east of a line drawn north and south (astronomically) through the mouth of the Fraser River, open season from September 15th, 1944, to December 15th, 1944.

(B) WILSON'S SNipe, in the districts mentioned in clause (A), open season from September 15th, 1944, to November 15th, 1944.

(C) CALIFORNIA QUAIL, in the South Okanagan, North and South Okanagan, and that portion of the Electoral District of Similkameen situated and lying east of a line drawn north and south (astronomically) through the mouth of the Fraser River, open season from October 1st, 1944, to October 31st, 1944.

(D) WILSON'S SNipe, in the districts mentioned in clause (A), open season from September 15th, 1944, to November 15th, 1944.

SEALAND GAME BIRDS.

(A) CALIFORNIA QUAIL, in the South Okanagan, North and South Okanagan, and that portion of the Electoral District of Similkameen situated and lying to the north of the 53rd parallel of north latitude and east of the Fraser River, open season from October 1st, 1944, to November 15th, 1944.

(B) EUROPEAN PARTRIDGE, in the Kamloops, Salmon Arm, North and South Okanagan, and Similkameen Electoral Districts, open season from October 1st, 1944, to October 31st, 1944.

In that portion of the Grand Forks-Greenwood Electoral District situated and lying to the east of a line drawn north and south (astronomically) through the station at Elk Valley, Kettle Valley Railway, open season from October 1st, 1944, to October 31st, 1944.

(C) GIBBS (Blue or Frank's only), in the Eastern District, in those portions thereof known as the Fort George, Peace River, Okanagan, Skeena, and Athol Electoral Districts, open season from September 15th, 1944, to October 31st, 1944.
