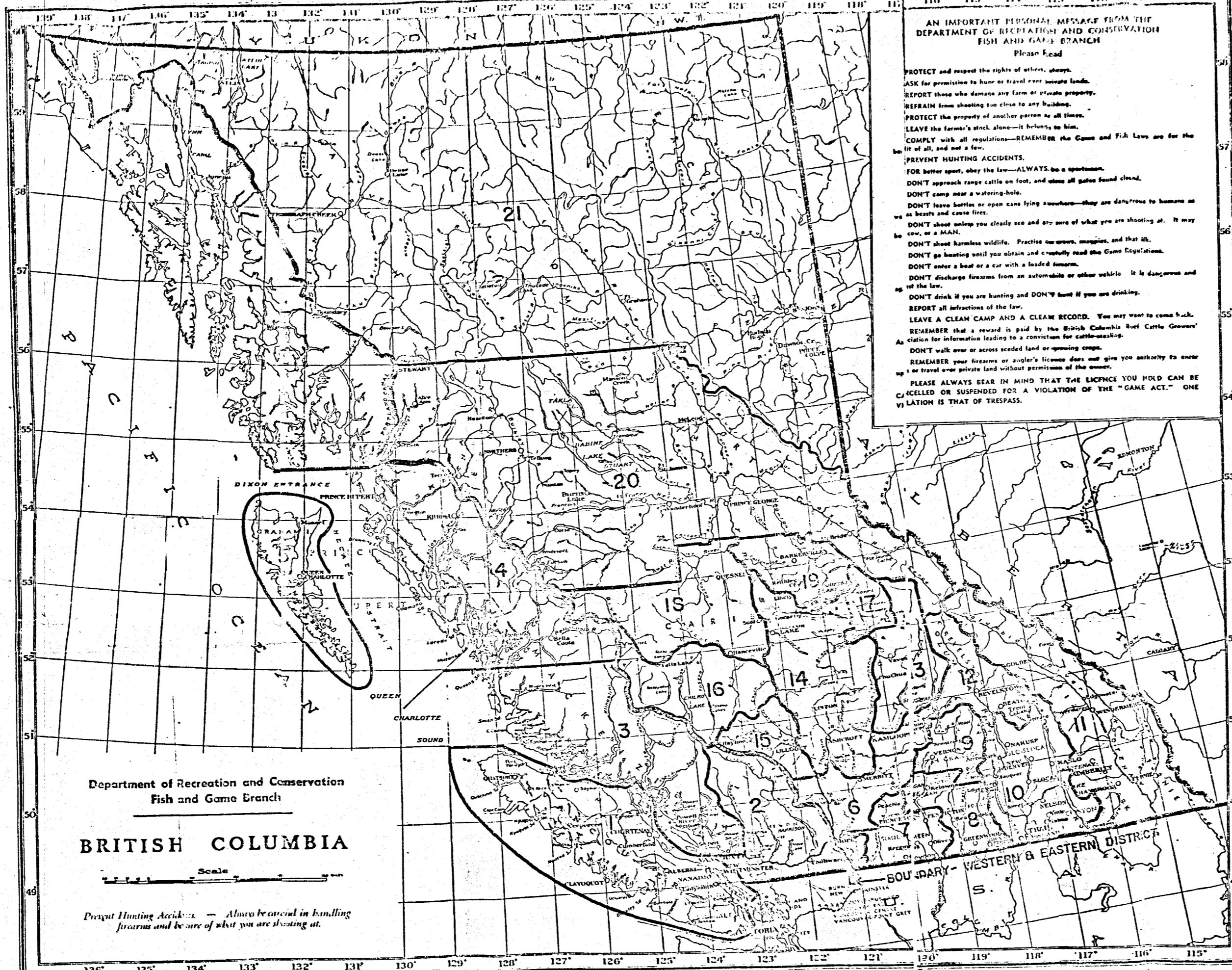

AN IMPORTANT PERSONAL MESSAGE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION AND CONSERVATION FISH AND GAME BRANCH

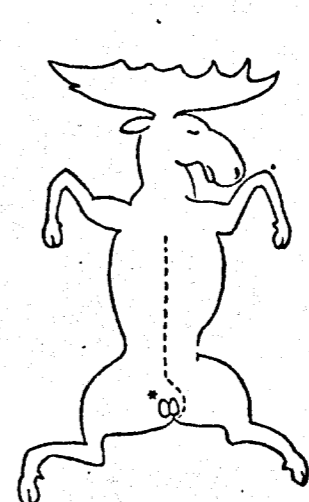
**Please Read**

- PROTECT** and respect the rights of others, always.
- ASK** for permission to hunt or travel over private lands.
- REPORT** those who damage any farm or private property.
- REFRAIN** from shooting too close to any building.
- PROTECT** the property of another person at all times.
- LEAVE** the farmer's stock alone—it belongs to him.
- COMPLY** with all regulations—REMEMBER the Game and Fish Laws are for the fit of all, and not a few.
- PREVENT** HUNTING ACCIDENTS.
- FOR** better sport, obey the law—ALWAYS be a sportsman.
- DON'T** approach range cattle on foot, and close all gates found closed.
- DON'T** camp near a watering-hole.
- DON'T** leave bottles or open cans lying about—these are dangerous to humans as well as to animals.
- DON'T** shoot unless you clearly see and are sure of what you are shooting at. It may be a COYOTE, or a MAN.
- DON'T** shoot harmless wildlife. Practice our own, magpies, and that ilk.
- DON'T** go hunting until you obtain and carefully read the Game Regulations.
- DON'T** enter a boat or a car with a loaded firearm.
- DON'T** discharge firearms from an automobile or other vehicle. It is dangerous and against the law.
- DON'T** drink if you are hunting and DON'T hunt if you are drinking.
- REPORT** all infractions of the law.
- LEAVE** A CLEAN CAMP AND A CLEAN RECORD. You may want to come back.
- REMEMBER** that a reward is paid by the British Columbia Beef Cattle Growers' Association for information leading to a conviction for poaching.
- DON'T** walk over or across seeded land or opening crops.
- REMEMBER** your firearms or angler's license does not give you authority to enter up or travel over private land without permission of the owner.
- PLEASE ALWAYS BEAR IN MIND THAT THE LICENSE YOU HOLD CAN BE CANCELLED OR SUSPENDED FOR A VIOLATION OF THE "GAME ACT". ONE VIOLATION IS THAT OF TRESPASS.**



**WARNING**

A firearm is a dangerous weapon. -- Watch every person hunting to see that firearms are handled and used safely.



**EVIDENCE OF SEX AND IDENTITY**

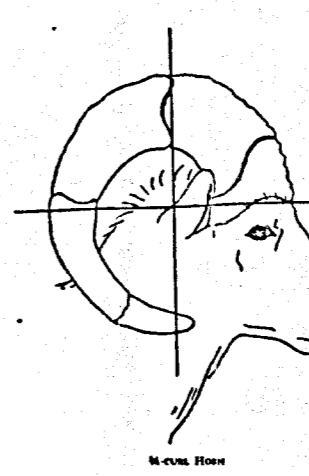
A safe way to comply with the evidence of sex regulation is to carry a tag with the name of the hunter on it.

**Tags**—If you remove cartridges and shells, leave one around—placed in one hand.

**Notes**—If you skin your game, carcass must remain attached to meat on piece of hide.

**\*Skins**—Sacs containing testicles.

Assist in preventing hunting accidents. Report any person found carrying or using a firearm carelessly.



**GAME SHIPMENTS**

No person shall make any shipment of any big game, or any part thereof, or the skin of any game animal, whether for export or for distribution within the Province, by mail, railway, steamship, or express company, or other common carrier, without first procuring a permit from the Game Warden.

**TROPHY FEES**

Trophy fees on game killed south of the 56th parallel of north latitude are as follows:—

On each Caribou, Grizzly Bear, Mountain sheep, Wapiti (Bull)	\$50.00
On each Moose	40.00
On each Mule or White-tailed Deer	25.00
On each Coast or Columbian Deer	15.00
On each Elk or Brown Bear	5.00

Trophy fees on game killed north of the 56th parallel of north latitude are as follows:—

On each Caribou, Grizzly Bear, Mountain sheep, Wapiti (Bull)	\$25.00
On each Moose	40.00
On each Mule or White-tailed Deer, Mountain-goat	15.00
On each Black or Brown Bear	5.00

**Study your regulations carefully. Watch that firearm.**

**GAME-TAG REGULATIONS**

(Orders in Council No. 1212 and 1766, approved May 3rd, 1931, and July 14th, 1932.)

- Each deer, moose, wapiti (bull), and mountain-goat as defined under the "Game Act" shall, immediately following its killing or taking thereof, have a seal which has been previously used attached to the carcass thereof, and such seal must be securely and permanently attached to the horns or other part of the carcass and must be locked by the person killing or taking the animal and to whom the seal has been issued in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.
- Seals may be issued by a Game Warden, Constable, Government Agent, or any person authorized by the Game Commission and the person shall be in the shape and style as decided upon by the Game Commission, and shall be valid for the year in which said seal or seals are issued.
- A fee of fifty cents (50c) shall be payable for every seal for a deer, and a fee of two dollars (\$2) for each moose-elk and mountain-goat seal.
- The seal shall remain on the carcass of the deer, moose, wapiti (bull), or mountain-goat until the carcass has been removed or transported to the place where it is proposed to consume the carcass.
- The transfer of any seal or seal by any holder of a license under the "Game Act" to any person whatsoever is prohibited.
- These regulations shall not apply in respect to any deer, moose, wapiti (bull), or mountain-goat killed by an Indian, prospector, surveyor, or farmer (on his own premises only) for use for food purposes in accordance with the provisions of sections 1 and 7 of the "Game Act".
- Any person authorized to issue firearms licenses, and from whom a seal has been issued, shall be liable for the loss of the seal if it is not checked in the books provided for this purpose on the purchaser's firearms license.
- Any person found in possession of the carcass of a deer, moose, wapiti (bull), or mountain-goat to which a seal has not been securely and permanently attached and locked shall be deemed to have committed an offence against the regulations.
- The seal or seal referred to herein must be used in accordance with the provisions of the regulations passed from time to time under the "Game Act".
- Any game mentioned herein which has been taken in any Provincial Park designated by the Honorable the Minister of Lands and Forests shall also be tagged or sealed as outlined in these regulations and with an extra tag or seal to be furnished from or supplied by the British Columbia Forest Service of the Department of Lands and Forests under any regulation of that Department.

**NOTICE TO NON-RESIDENT BIG-GAME HUNTERS**

Any NON-RESIDENT HUNTER, in order to export trophies secured, must obtain a permit for this purpose from any Game Warden or Government Agent. This permit will be issued upon payment of the fees due on trophies being exported as set forth in the regulations. Trophy fees are payable on any or all big game killed whether exported or otherwise.

**NON-RESIDENTS** of the Province hunting big game must be accompanied by a British Columbia Game Warden.

Hunters who wish to ship their trophies from the Province must comply with the provisions of the "Game Act" and the Customs Regulations.
