

CLOSED AREAS

PROHIBITIONS, CLOSED AREAS, ETC. WESTERN DISTRICT

The open seasons declared by these regulations shall not apply to the following parts of the Western District, namely:—

(a) Kaien Island, in the Prince Rupert Electoral District.

(b) That portion of the Mackenzie Electoral District in the vicinity of Ocean Falls described as follows: "Commencing at the south-west corner of Lot 1153; thence in a straight line due west for one mile; thence in a straight line due north to a point about one-quarter mile due east of Mokst Lake; thence north-easterly in a straight line to the north-east corner of Lot 209; thence easterly in a straight line from said corner of said lot to a point one-half mile east of Martin River; thence south-easterly in a straight line to the north-west corner of Lot 1170; thence along the northern boundary of said lot to the west shore of Linn Lake; thence along said shore of said lake in a southerly direction to the south-east corner of Lot 1151; thence along the south boundaries of Lots 1151 and 1162 to the south-west corner of Lot 1162; thence westerly in a straight line to the south-west corner of Lot 1176; thence in a straight line westerly across Cousins Inlet to the point of commencement."

(c) That portion of the Mackenzie Electoral District known as Minstrel Island Harbour, or more particularly all that area from the north-east corner of Lot 648 to a sign posted on the shore-line approximately one-half mile south-east of the wharf at or in the harbour of Minstrel Island, wherein the discharge of firearms of any kind is prohibited at any time.

(d) No person shall hunt or shoot migratory game birds below high-water mark in those waters of Vancouver Island known as Brentwood Bay and Tod Inlet extending south of a straight line running east and west from Sluggert Point to Willis Point and all that strip of land covered by water in width one thousand (1,000) feet, measured seaward from high-water mark of the easterly shore of Vancouver Island, and which extends from the northerly extremity of the Esquimalt Spit to the Albert Head Lighthouse, Esquimalt Land District, as well as that strip of land three hundred (300) feet in width measured inland from said high-water mark and which extends from the southerly extremity of said Esquimalt Spit to the said Albert Head Lighthouse.

(e) All that parcel or tract of land lying within the following described boundaries and being part of Esquimalt and Goldstream Land Districts: "Commencing at a point on the west side of the Island Highway situate three hundred (300) yards northerly from the corner of the said highway with the Sooke and Metchosin Road; thence in a westerly direction parallel to and distant therefrom three hundred (300) yards from the northerly boundary of the Island Highway to the westerly boundary of the Esquimalt Land District; thence southerly along said boundary to the shore of Langford Lake; thence westerly, southerly, and easterly along the said shore of said lake to the said westerly boundary of Esquimalt Land District; thence southerly along said boundary to the southerly boundary of the Esquimalt and Nanaimo Railway right-of-way; thence along the said southerly boundary to its intersection with Dunford Road; thence southerly at right angles to said railway right-of-way a distance of three hundred (300) yards; thence in an easterly direction parallel to and distant therefrom three hundred (300) yards from said Island Highway to the westerly boundary of the Sooke and Metchosin Road; thence northerly along said westerly boundary of said road and the Island Highway to the point of commencement."

(f) That portion of Ganges Harbour below high-water mark lying north of a straight line running from Scott Point due west to the nearest point on the west shore-line of said harbour.

(g) That portion of the Dewdney Electoral District known as Colony Farm, and that further portion of the said electoral district in the vicinity of Harrison Hot Springs more particularly described as follows: "Commencing at the mouth of an unnamed slough entering Harrison Lake west of the Harrison Hot Springs Hotel; thence along the south shore-line of said unnamed slough to the Agassiz-Harrison Highway; thence northerly along said highway to Harrison Lake; thence westerly along the shore-line of said lake to the point of commencement."

(h) That portion of the Municipality of Matsqui consisting of approximately two hundred (200) acres of land bounded on the north by the Trans-Canada Highway, on the south by Marshall Road, on the east by Ware Road, and on the west by Emerson Road.

(i) Those portions of the Surrey Municipality and the Corporation of the City of White Rock described as follows:—

"(a) Commencing at the intersection of the south bank of the Fraser River and the Coast Meridian Road (168th Street) produced; thence southerly along said street to Hurst Road (80th Avenue); thence westerly along said avenue produced to Johnston Road (152nd Street); thence southerly along said street to Burkhart

Road (68th Avenue); thence westerly along said avenue produced to Scott Road (120th Street); thence north along said street to Townline Road (96th Avenue); thence west along said avenue produced to the south bank of the Fraser River; thence northerly and easterly following the shoreline of the south bank of said river to the point of commencement.

"(b) Commencing at the intersection of the Ewenson Road (60th Avenue) and the Scott Road (120th Street); thence southerly along the said street produced to the foot of Panorama Ridge; thence easterly along the foot of said ridge to Rankin Road (148th Street) produced; thence north along said street to Ewenson Road (60th Avenue); thence west along said avenue to the point of commencement."

"(c) Commencing at the intersection of the Murphy Road (172nd Street) with the New McLellan Road (56th Avenue); thence north along the Murphy Road to the Old McLellan Road (60th Avenue); thence east along 60th Avenue to the Thomas Road (182nd Street); thence south along the Thomas Road to 56th Avenue; thence west along 56th Avenue to the point of commencement."

"(d) That area in the vicinity of The Corporation of the City of White Rock as follows: Commencing at the junction or intersection of the North Bluff Road (16th Avenue) and the Stevenson Road (128th Street); thence east along the North Bluff Road to Stayte Road; thence south along Stayte Road to Semiammo Bay; thence north-westerly following the high-water mark of said bay to Stevenson Road; thence north along said road to the point of commencement."

(j) Those portions of the Chilliwack River Valley closed to hunting and the discharge of firearms as set out by signs erected by the Fish and Game Branch and/or Department of the Attorney-General.

PROHIBITIONS, CLOSED AREAS, ETC. EASTERN DISTRICT

The open seasons declared by these regulations shall not apply to the following parts of the Eastern District, namely:—

(a) Those portions of the Yale and Similkameen Electoral Districts situate and lying within the boundaries of Manning Park and Three Brothers Mountain Game Reserve and extending to Whipsaw Creek, a distance of 48.5 miles when entering Manning Park or said game reserve from the west or the east.

(b) That portion of Yale Electoral District in the vicinity of Minnie Lake described as follows: "Commencing at the north-east corner of Lot 1177; thence westerly along the northerly boundaries of Lots 1177 and 1176 to the north-west corner of Lot 1176; thence following a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the north-west corner of Lot 1288; thence easterly along the northerly boundary of said lot to the north-east corner of Lot 1288; thence southerly along the easterly boundary of said lot to the south-east corner of said lot; thence along the southern boundary of Lot 1288 to the north-east corner of Lot 1119; thence along the easterly boundaries of Lots 1119, 1118, and 1099 to the south-east corner of Lot 1099; thence south-easterly in a straight line to the nearest point on the north bank of Quichen Lake; thence along the north shore of said creek to the south-east corner of Lot 490; thence along the easterly boundary of Lot 490 to the north-east corner of said lot; thence along the southerly boundary of Lot 695 to the south-east corner of said lot; thence along the east boundary of Lot 695 to the north-west corner of Lot 683; thence in a straight line from the north-west corner of Lot 683 in a north-westerly direction to Lots 695, 694, and 1178 to the point of commencement."

(c) That portion of the Kamloops Electoral District described as follows: "All waters of the North Thompson, South Thompson, and Thompson Rivers bounded on the north by the Canadian National Railway Bridge (main line) at Kamloops Junction, and on the east by the Kamloops-Blue River Highway bridge at Kamloops, and on the west by the Kamloops-Tranquille Highway bridge."

Provided that the provisions of this clause shall apply only in respect to the hunting of game birds.

(d) That portion of the South Okanagan Electoral District in the vicinity of Kelowna known as Lot M, Plan 920, Osoyoos Division of Yale District (comprising land surrounding trout-ponds near Kelowna).

(e) That portion of the South Okanagan Electoral District in the vicinity of Kelowna known as Knox Mountain Park.

(f) That portion of the Salmon Arm Electoral District described as follows: "Commencing at the mouth of Scamou (Two Mile) Creek; thence following the east shore-line of Mara Lake, Scamou Narrows, and Shuswap Lake in a north-westerly direction to Murdoch Point, which is approximately two (2) miles north-west of Scamou; thence in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to Semaphore Point one (1) mile west of Scamou; thence easterly along the shore-line of Shuswap Lake to Scamou Narrows; thence southerly following the west shore-line of Scamou Narrows and Mara Lake to a point known as 'Hunters Point'; thence in a straight line two (2) miles south of Scamou; thence in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the point of commencement."

That portion of the Salmon Arm of Shuswap Lake within the boundary of the Municipality of Salmon Arm lying south-easterly of a straight line of approximately one and one-quarter (1 1/4) miles in length, commencing at the outer end of the Salmon Arm wharf; thence north-easterly to a white marker where the shore-line of said Salmon Arm of Shuswap Lake intersects with the northern boundary of the North-west quarter of Section 24, Township 20, Range 10.

Provided that the provisions of this clause shall apply only in respect to the hunting of game birds.

(g) In those portions of the South Okanagan Electoral District as follows: "Commencing at the intersection of the West Kootenay Power and Light Company right-of-way and Okanagan Highway No. 97, situate and lying in the District Lot 119; thence north-easterly and northerly along the east boundary of said right-of-way to the northerly boundary of Section 35; thence westerly along the northerly boundaries of Sections 35 and 34 to Okanagan Highway No. 97; thence southerly along the said highway to the point of commencement."

(h) That portion of the Nelson-Creston Electoral District described as follows: "Commencing on the north shore of the West Arm of Kootenay Lake at Willow Point wharf; thence following the Duhamel or Six Mile Creek Road to the intersection of the said Duhamel Road with the First West Fork of Duhamel Creek; thence following the said West Fork to its source; thence in a southerly direction following the divide between Duhamel Creek and the West Arm of Kootenay Lake and Grohman Creek to the said creek; thence across the West Arm of Kootenay Lake to the south shore of the West Arm to a point known as the slaughter-house; thence following the south shore of the said West Arm in an easterly direction to a point opposite Willow Point wharf; thence across the said West Arm to the point of commencement."

Provided that the provisions of this clause shall apply only in respect to the hunting of game birds.

(i) That portion of the Fernie Electoral District described as follows: "Commencing at the junction of Bovine (Goat) Creek with the Elk River; thence in a south-easterly direction to the site of the East Kootenay Power and Light Company's water-gate on the Fording River; thence along the west bank of said river to the junction of said river and the Elk River; thence along the east bank of Elk River to the point of commencement."

Provided that the provisions of this clause shall not apply in respect to the trapping of fur-bearing animals.

(j) That portion of the Cariboo Electoral District within a radius of one (1) mile of the Townsite of Wells.

(k) That portion of the Atlin Electoral District described as follows: "Commencing at Mill Street on the shore of Atlin Lake; thence easterly to First Street; thence northerly along said street to Watson Avenue; thence east one block along said avenue to Second Street; thence north two blocks along said street to Pearl Avenue; thence east one block along said avenue to Third Street; thence northerly two blocks along said street to Discovery Avenue; thence easterly along said avenue to Seventh Street; thence southerly approximately three thousand eight hundred (3,800) feet along said street to McKee Creek Road; thence south-easterly approximately one thousand nine hundred and fifty (1,950) feet to Johnson's Road; thence westerly along said road four thousand one hundred and forty (4,140) feet to the shore of Atlin Lake; thence north-westerly along the shore of said lake to the point of commencement."

Provided that the provisions of this clause shall only apply in respect to the hunting of migratory game birds.

(l) That portion of the Fort George Electoral District known as Buckthorn (Buckhorn) Lake, wherein the shooting, molesting, or disturbing of migratory game birds is prohibited.

(m) There shall be no open season on any member of the DEER FAMILY in those portions of the Eastern District described as follows:—

In that portion of the Fernie Electoral District described as follows: "Commencing at the junction of Morrissey Creek and Elk River; thence following the east and south banks of said river to a point one-half mile south of the junction of Wigwam and Elk Rivers; thence easterly following the summit of the watershed on the south side of Wigwam River to a point on the said river one-half mile south of the junction of the said river and Lodgepole Creek; thence in an easterly direction following the summit of the watershed on the south side of said creek to the summit at the headwaters of the said creek; thence northerly following the summit of the said watershed and westerly along the summit on the north side of the said creek and Meadow Creek to a point on Morrissey Creek two (2) miles north-east from the mouth of said creek; thence along the south bank of said creek to the point of commencement."

In that portion of the Atlin Electoral District situate and lying north of the 59th parallel of latitude. The provisions of this clause shall apply only in respect to the hunting of deer.

NOTE:—The closed areas mentioned under the headings "Western District" and "Eastern District" are not game reserves. Game reserves are set aside by separate order or regulation and consequently are not listed herein.

SAFETY TIPS AND REGULATIONS...

AN IMPORTANT PERSONAL MESSAGE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION AND CONSERVATION FISH AND GAME BRANCH

PLEASE READ

PROTECT and respect the rights of others.
ASK for permission to hunt or travel over private lands.
REPORT those who damage any farm or private property.
REFRAIN from shooting too close to any building.
PROTECT the property of another person at all times.
LEAVE the farmer's stock alone — it belongs to him.
COMPLY with all regulations — **REMEMBER** the Game and Fish Laws are for the benefit of all, and not a few.
PREVENT HUNTING ACCIDENTS.
FOR better sport, obey the law — **ALWAYS** be a sportsman.
DON'T approach range cattle on foot, and close all gates found closed.
DON'T camp near a watering-hole.
DON'T leave bottles or open cans lying anywhere — they are dangerous to humans as well as beasts and cause fires.
DON'T shoot unless you clearly see and are sure of what you are shooting at. It may be a cow, or a MAN.
DON'T shoot harmless wildlife.
REMEMBER — Hawks, owls and eagles are protected under the Game Act.
DON'T go hunting until you obtain and carefully read the Game Regulations.
DON'T enter a boat or a car with a loaded firearm.
DON'T discharge firearms from an automobile or other vehicle. It is dangerous and against the law.
DON'T drink if you are hunting and **DON'T** hunt if you are drinking.
REPORT all infractions of the law.
LEAVE A CLEAN CAMP AND A CLEAN RECORD. You may want to come back.
REMEMBER that a reward is paid by the British Columbia Beef Cattle Growers' Association for information leading to a conviction for cattle-stealing.
DON'T walk over or across seeded land or growing crops.
REMEMBER your firearms or angler's licence does not give you authority to enter upon or travel over private land without permission of the owner.

PLEASE ALWAYS BEAR IN MIND THAT THE LICENCE YOU HOLD CAN BE CANCELLED OR SUSPENDED FOR A VIOLATION OF THE "GAME ACT." ONE VIOLATION IS THAT OF TRESPASS.

IT IS UNLAWFUL

To use any swivel, set-gun, machine gun, or battery, or any gun larger than a 10-gauge, or a pump or automatic shotgun without a plug — magazine to hold two shells.
To hunt any game between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or during the prohibited time or period mentioned in the Game Regulations.
To carry loaded firearms in or on or discharge same from an automobile or other vehicle either on or off a highway.
To have in possession, place, or set poison for the taking or killing of any game.
To use pit-lamps or lights of any description at any time for the purpose of hunting game birds or animals.
To remove all evidence as to sex from any member of the deer family or mountain-sheep which has been killed until the carcass or carcasses of said animals have been taken to place of consumption. When head is removed from carcass, some other evidence of sex must be visible.
To remove all feathers from upland game birds to the extent that the species cannot be identified.
To hunt game from any sailboat, powerboat, or aeroplane.
To use any other persons' licence or permit, or to loan or transfer any licence or permit under any circumstances.
To allow any dog to hunt or run any caribou, moose, wapiti, or deer at any time, or to run at large hunting game birds between April 1st and July 31st, both dates inclusive.
To angle for fish in non-tidal waters without a licence.
To carry firearms or traps without a licence.
To kill a deer, goat, moose, elk, or pheasant, and retain same in possession before taken to place of consumption without first tagging the carcass in accordance with the provisions of the Game-tagging Regulations.
To frighten or disturb any game birds on the waters of any game reserve by discharging a rifle or other firearm, or by firing shots from a rifle or other firearm, upon, over, or across any game reserve.
To operate any aircraft for hunting, fishing, or trapping purposes contrary to the provisions of the regulations in this regard.
Full co-operation is respectfully requested of licence-holders who have been requested to submit their game returns on a form supplied by the Fish and Game Branch.

Section 2
BAG-LIMITS

WESTERN DISTRICT

BIG GAME

DEER: On Vancouver Island, or G.M.A. No. 1, three (3), of which two (2) may be antlerless animals. Throughout the remainder of the Western District, two (2), of which one (1) may be an antlerless animal if shot in an area provided with an open season under these regulations.

On Vancouver Island no person shall have in his possession at any one time more than two (2) DEER when actually hunting or proceeding to or from any hunt. In G.M.A. No. 5 there shall be no bag-limit, and no Deer shot, killed, or taken, shall be exported or shipped from said area during any other period than from September 16th to December 3rd, and any Deer shot in said game management area must be tagged in accordance with the provisions of the Game-Tagging Regulations.

UPLAND GAME BIRDS

GROUSE: Daily bag-limit, eight (8) of which six (6) may be RUFFED or WILLOW GROUSE if an open season is provided thereon; possession limit, forty (40) in the aggregate.

PTARMIGAN: Daily bag-limit, six (6); possession limit, twenty-four (24).

QUAIL (CALIFORNIA): Daily bag-limit, in that portion of G.M.A. No. 1 provided with an open season, ten (10); possession limit, thirty (30).

PHEASANTS (COCK BIRDS ONLY): In those portions of the Western District provided with an open season in these regulations, daily bag-limit, two (2); season bag-limit, ten (10); except in that portion of Vancouver Island situate and lying south of the Shawnigan Lake Cut-off Road, wherein the daily bag-limit shall be four (4); season bag-limit, ten (10); provided that in areas where the shooting of hen pheasants is permitted, the daily bag-limit may contain two (2) hen birds.

EASTERN DISTRICT

BIG GAME

CARIBOU, BULLS ONLY, over one year of age, one (1), but in those portions of the Eastern District where an either-sex season is permitted, one (1), but the maximum bag-limit during the open season shall be one (1) CARIBOU only.

DEER: Two (2), of which one (1) may be an antlerless animal, except in G.M.A. No. 10 where in the bag-limit shall be two (2) DEER of either sex or any age.

MOUNTAIN-SHEEP, RAMS ONLY, over one year of age: One (1).

UPLAND GAME BIRDS

CALIFORNIA QUAIL: Daily bag-limit, ten (10); possession limit, thirty (30).

GROUSE (BLUE, RUFFED or WILLOW, and FRANKLIN'S): Throughout the Eastern District, daily bag-limit, ten (10), provided that not more than eight (8) shall be BLUE GROUSE; possession limit, thirty (30).

PTARMIGAN: Throughout the Eastern District, daily bag-limit, ten (10); possession limit, thirty (30).

SHARP-TAILED GROUSE: Throughout those portions of the Eastern District provided with an open season, daily bag-limit, six (6); possession limit, eighteen (18).

PARTRIDGE (HUNGARIAN and CHUKAR): Daily bag-limit, ten (10) in the aggregate; possession limit, thirty (30) in the aggregate.

PHEASANTS (COCK BIRDS ONLY): Throughout those portions of the Eastern District provided with an open season in these regulations, daily bag-limit, three (3); season bag-limit ten (10).

THROUGHOUT THE PROVINCE

BIG GAME

BEAR: In that portion of the Province situate and lying north of the 57th parallel of latitude and west of the Rocky Mountains, two (2) Grizzly Bear. Throughout the remainder of the Province, one (1) Grizzly Bear. No bag-limit on Black or Brown Bear.

MOOSE and WAPITI (ELK): One (1)—combination bag-limit of one (1) Moose or one (1) Wapiti (Elk), but not both.

MOUNTAIN-GOAT over one year of age: In G.M.A. Nos. 7 and 8, one (1); throughout the remainder of the Province, two (2).

MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS

COOTS: Daily bag-limit, eight (8); possession limit, thirty-two (32); except Indians who may take twenty-five (25) daily, with no possession limit.

DUCKS (except EIDER DUCKS): Daily bag-limit, six (6), of which not more than one (1) may be a Wood Duck.

GEESSE: Daily bag-limit, five (5) in the aggregate of all kinds; except in the Nelson-Creston Electoral District wherein the daily bag-limit shall be three (3) in the aggregate of all kinds; possession limit ten (10).

BLACK BRANT: Daily bag-limit, three (3); possession limit six (6).

WILSON'S SNIPE: Daily bag-limit, eight (8). PIGEONS (BAND-TAILED): Daily bag-limit, ten (10).

MOURNING DOVES: In those portions of the Province provided with an open season, daily bag-limit, ten (10).

PROVIDED no person shall have in his possession more than two days' bag-limit of migratory game birds when actually hunting or returning from hunting, but any such person may in addition have in his place of residence or in a cold-storage locker plant not more than a further two days' bag-limit of Ducks only.

Section 3
POSSESSION LIMITS

No person shall, in any district designated in these regulations, kill or take on any one day any greater number of game birds than the daily bag-limits mentioned, or kill or take or have in his possession during the entire open season more game birds than the maximum number to be killed, taken, or had in possession in any district.

Throughout the Province no person shall at any time kill or take or have in his possession during the entire open season more big-game animals than the maximum number permitted to be killed, taken, or had in possession in any district.

Every person shall, upon the request of any Conservation Officer or Constable, furnish satis-

factory proof to him of the locality and date on which any game was by him killed, taken, or had in possession.

Section 4
SALE OF BIG GAME

The prohibitions declared by subsection (1) of section 26 of the "Game Act" as to the buying, selling, or having in possession of big game, so far as same relate to game lawfully killed or taken, are hereby removed to the extent and within the periods and limits, and subject to the provisions hereinafter set out, as follows:—

BEAR (except White or Kermodei Bear), throughout the Province, at any time during the open season, provided that Grizzly Bear hide or hides shall not be sold at any time without a permit.

PROVIDED further that no other big game or portion thereof shall be sold in the Province.

Section 5
HUNTING RESTRICTIONS

No person shall at any time kill, or attempt to kill, any Migratory Game Bird, Pheasant, Partridge, or Quail with a rifle or hunt, as defined in section 2 of the "Game Act," any game birds in any field or on or over cultivated land by using an automobile or other vehicle thereon.

No person shall hunt, kill, or attempt to kill any Migratory Game Bird by the use or aid of baiting, and no person shall hunt, kill, or attempt to kill any Migratory Game Birds within one-half mile of any place, reserved or otherwise, where baiting is being done, or where it has been done less than fourteen (14) days before the first day of the open season for Ducks or Geese in the district in which the said place is situated, and in this section baiting means placing or exposing, corn, wheat, oats, or other grain or products thereof, or any food or other materials which may have the effect of attracting wild birds.

No person shall build or construct at any place in the Province before the day prior to the first day of the open season for Migratory Game Birds at that place a blind of any kind that can be used in connection with the hunting of the said Migratory Game Birds.

The use of live decoys in the hunting or taking of any Migratory Game Birds anywhere in the Province is prohibited. No person shall, while hunting Migratory Game Birds, have with him more than one shotgun at one time.

The shooting of Migratory Game Birds from a power-boat when such power-boat is beached, resting at anchor, or fastened within or tied immediately alongside of any type of fixed hunting blind is permissible.

The open seasons declared by these regulations shall not apply to the hunting, taking, or having in possession of Quail, Pheasant, or Hungarian Partridge at any place when the surface of the ground at that place is covered with snow.

Section 6
HUNTING METHODS

No person shall hunt, kill, or take any Moose, Caribou, Wapiti (Elk), or Deer while swimming, and the hunting, killing, or taking of any game by the use of tracer bullets or tracer-shot shells is prohibited.

In the hunting of big game the use of any rifle loaded with rim-fire shells, the use of military ammunition whether modified or otherwise, and the use of any firearm that can be or is classed as a machine gun or sub-machine gun is prohibited. This regulation is not intended to prohibit the use of arms of the self- or auto-loading types in which the recoil or force of the

explosion is utilized to reload but not to fire the weapon.

No person shall have in his possession the carcass or portion of the carcass of any member of the Deer Family or Mountain-Sheep without proof of sex unless the carcass has been transported to the place where it is proposed to consume the carcass.

The hunting or shooting of Deer by the use of a shotgun is prohibited throughout the Province (except in G.M.A. No. 2 and in any municipality which prohibits the discharge of rifles), and in G.M.A. Nos. 1, 2 (except in those municipalities which prohibit the discharge of rifles), 3, 4 and 5 and in the Eastern District the use of shotguns (20 gauge or larger) loaded with rifled slugs is permitted.

"Deer Family," for the purpose of these regulations, shall mean and include Moose, Caribou, Deer and Wapiti (Elk).

Section 7
GUIDING RESTRICTIONS

No guide shall guide more than two persons at any one time on any big-game hunting trip, and no guide shall operate as such except in the district allocated to him and as set out on his guide's licence.

Section 8
DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS

No person shall discharge a firearm over, on, or across any travelled road or highway within the boundaries of any municipality, or within the boundaries of the Esquimalt, Cowichan-Newcastle, Dewdney, and Chilliwack Electoral Districts, and in the North Saanich District and in the Municipalities of Delta, Surrey, and Sumas the discharge of firearms of any description on, over, or within any road allowance is prohibited. Any person who discharges a firearm over, on, or across any highway or road in the Province without reasonable consideration for other persons using the highway or road or persons or property adjacent to the highway or road shall be in violation of these regulations.

No person shall build or construct at any place in the Province before the day prior to the first day of the open season for Migratory Game Birds at that place a blind of any kind that can be used in connection with the hunting of the said Migratory Game Birds.

TROPHY FEES

Trophy fees on game killed south of the 56th parallel of north latitude are as follows:—

Trophy fees on game killed north of the 56th parallel of north latitude are as follows:—

Study your regulations carefully.

Watch that firearm.

GAME-TAGGING REGULATIONS
(Order in Council No. 1723, approved July 6th, 1961)

1. For the purpose of these regulations any tag mentioned herein shall be known as a "Game-Tag Permit" which is not transferable.

2. Each deer, moose, wapiti (elk), mountain-goat, and pheasant, as defined in the "Game Act" shall immediately following the killing or taking thereof, have a tag, which has not been previously used, attached to the carcass thereof, and such tag shall be securely and permanently attached to the antlers or other part of the carcass of any deer, moose, wapiti (elk), or mountain-goat, and in the case of a pheasant, to the leg immediately above the spur. The said tag must be attached by the person killing or taking the animal or bird.

3. Tags may be issued by a Conservation Officer, Constable, Government Agent, or any person authorized by the Director of the Fish and Game Branch, and said tag shall be in the shape and style as decided upon by the said Director, and shall be valid for the hunting season for which said tag or tags are issued.

4. A fee of fifty cents (50c) shall be payable for each tag for a deer, a fee of two dollars (\$2) for each moose-elk and mountain-goat tag, and a fee of fifty cents (50c) for each card of five pheasant tags. No person shall make application for or have in his possession at any time, or be issued with more tags than the season's limit set out in the Game Regulations.

5. The tag shall remain on the carcass of the deer, moose, wapiti (elk), mountain-goat, or pheasant until the carcass has been removed or transported to the place where it is proposed to consume the said animal or bird.

6. These regulations shall not apply in respect to any deer, moose, wapiti (elk), or mountain-goat killed by an Indian, prospector, surveyor, or farmer (on his own property only) for use for food pursuant to the provisions of sections 7 to 10 of the "Game Act."

7. Any person authorized to issue firearms licences, and from whom any of the tags mentioned herein have been purchased, shall note the numbers of the said tag and describe the kind so purchased in the space provided for this purpose on the purchaser's firearms licence.

8. The tag or tags referred to herein must be used in accordance with the regulations passed from time to time under the "Game Act."

9. Any game mentioned herein which has been taken in any Provincial park designated by the Honourable the Minister of Recreation and Conservation shall also be tagged as outlined in these regulations and with an extra tag or seal to be obtained from or supplied by, and under any regulation of the Parks Branch of the Department of Recreation and Conservation.

10. For the purpose of these regulations, any deer, moose, wapiti (elk), mountain-goat, or pheasant having a mutilated or tampered tag shall be deemed to be unsealed.

11. Any person found in possession of the carcass of a deer, moose, wapiti (elk), mountain-goat, or pheasant to which a designated tag has not been securely and permanently attached and sealed, shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these regulations.

NOTICE TO SPORTSMEN

"UNORGANIZED DISTRICT" means any part of the Province north of the 53rd parallel of north latitude.

LOADED FIREARMS: ANY FIREARM HAVING LIVE AMMUNITION in the magazine or breech is considered as being loaded under the "Game Act."

FIREARMS should not be carried without a licence. If you are in doubt, consult your nearest Conservation Officer.

After careful consideration it has been decided to ask the co-operation of all hunters to adopt a uniform DISTRESS SIGNAL, as follows: "Any hunter in the field, in case of accident, distress, or otherwise, should, as a signal, fire three shots, allowing a space of five seconds between each

shot, and should anyone hear this signal, he should reply by firing one shot. DISTRESS SIGNAL to be given, if possible, until replied to. If, after a signal has been replied to, the party is in need of assistance, he should repeat his first signal, but if not in need of assistance, it will not be necessary to repeat signal."

Any firearms-licence holder must, in hunting deer, moose, mountain-goat, wapiti (elk), or pheasant, be in possession of the required tag for tagging any such animal or pheasant shot in accordance with the Game-tagging Regulations.

Everyone is requested to report recovery of any banded bird, surrendering the band, furnishing particulars of species and sex of bird, and place where and when taken.

No credit can be given for unused game tags. Fees: Deer, 50 cents each; Goat or Moose-Elk, \$2; Pheasant (card of five), 50 cents.

The Regulations apply to resident and to non-resident hunters.

Hunters are requested by the Fish and Game Branch to refrain from killing female bears when it is known that they are accompanied by cubs. Do not shoot, take, or molest bear cubs. Remember it is unlawful to pick up or keep bear cubs and deer fawns.

Licence-holders hunting in a municipality are advised to acquaint themselves with any by-laws covering the discharge of firearms that may be in effect therein.

Keep your gun on "safe." Exercise care with firearms.

REGULATIONS DEALING WITH THE CANNING OF GAME AND THE CANNING AND POSSESSION OF TROUT

(Order in Council No. 1358, approved June 21st, 1946.)

1. For the purpose of these regulations the words "game" and "trout" shall be as defined in the "Game Act."

2. No person shall have in his possession anywhere in the Province at any one time, more trout than will in the aggregate amount to more than the possession in accordance with the daily bag-limit set out in the British Columbia Special Fishery Regulations.

3. No person shall, anywhere in the Province, process by canning or bottling any game or trout until said game or trout has been taken to the residence of the angler or hunter as shown on his licence issued pursuant to the provisions of the "Game Act"; provided that this regulation shall be subject to any regulation passed under the Provincial "Fisheries Act."

NOTICE TO PROSPECTORS

A prospector as defined under the "Game Act" is as follows:—

"Prospector" means a person who is the holder of a free miner's certificate under the 'Mineral Act' or the 'Placer-mining Act' and only while he is actually engaged personally in placer-mining or prospecting."

Any bona fide prospector who is the holder of any licence to carry firearms under section 36 of the "Game Act" may, during the open or close season in any unorganized district as defined above, hunt and kill and retain in his possession any game for his own use when in actual need of same for food while actually engaged in placer-mining or prospecting.

Any bona fide prospector in an organized district as defined above may hunt and kill and retain in his possession any game during the open season when in actual need of same for food while actually engaged in placer-mining or

prospecting, and in an organized district during the close season hunt and kill and retain in his possession any animals of the deer family, other than wapiti, of the male sex, over one year of age, after having obtained a permit therefor.

NOTICE TO NON-RESIDENT BIG-GAME HUNTERS

"Any NON-RESIDENT HUNTER, in order to export trophies secured, must obtain a permit for this purpose from any Conservation Officer or Government Agent. This permit will be issued upon payment of the fees due on trophies being exported as set forth in the regulations. Trophy fees are payable on any or all big game killed whether exported or otherwise."

NON-RESIDENTS of the Province hunting big game must be accompanied by a British Columbia licensed guide.

Hunters who wish to ship their trophies from the Province must comply with the provisions of the "Game Act" and the Canada Customs Regulations in that regard.

The following is a summary of the Customs and Game Regulations, which are being furnished for the convenience of non-resident big-game hunters:—

CUSTOM REGULATIONS

"Customs Invoices and Export Entry Forms must be tendered with the shipment.

Note.—Should there not be a Customs Officer at point of shipment, consign trophies to yourself at nearest Customs export point, have form completed on your arrival there, and deliver to the Depot Agent of the Express Company with request to reforward shipment to destination."


GAME SHIPMENTS

No person shall make any shipment of any big game, or any part thereof, or the eggs of any game bird, whether for export or to a destination within the Province, by any railway, steamship, or express company, or other common carrier, without first preparing the shipment so that the package or receptacle used for the purposes of the shipment may be easily opened for examination of the contents or else by preparing the shipment by plainly marking on the outside of the package or receptacle, or on a label securely attached thereto, a full description in detail of the contents; and no person shall make any shipment of any game, or any part thereof, or the eggs of any game bird, whether for export or to a destination within the Province, without first plainly marking on the package or receptacle used for purposes of the shipment, or on a label securely attached thereto, the names and addresses of the consignor and consignee of the shipment respectively, and also the number of any licence issued under the "Game Act" to the consignor.

Ask permission to hunt private property. Point firearm at game only.

WARNING — A firearm is a dangerous weapon. Watch every person hunting to see that firearms are handled and used safely.

Suggest Hunters wear clothing of the color fluorescent blaze-orange or fluorescent neon-red.




EVIDENCE OF SEX AND IDENTITY

The following is a safe easy way to comply with the evidence of sex regulations. Cut to one side of scrotum* when opening animal for gutting.

IMPORTANT.—If you remove testicles and penis, leave entire scrotum* intact on one hind quarter. Meat will not be tainted.

NOTE.—If you skin your game, scrotum must remain attached to meat on piece of hide.

*Scrotum: Sac containing testicles.



¾-CURL HORN

The horn of a mature mountain-sheep, the tip of which has grown through 270 degrees of the circle described by the outer surface of the horn, as seen from the side.

DEFINITION OF ANTLERLESS ANIMAL — An antlerless animal is a female or young animal of the year bearing no visible bony antlers. The small skin- or hair-covered protuberances on male fawns and calves do not constitute antlers. Such animals are antlerless for the purpose of these regulations. Over one year of age refers to a member of the deer family bearing visible antlers.

Assist in preventing hunting accidents. Report any person found carrying or using a firearm carelessly.

GAME REGULATIONS 1961-62

The prohibitions declared by section 18 of the "Game Act," being Chapter 180 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia, 1961, as to the hunting, possession, wounding, and killing of game, are, subject to the provisions of sections 2 to 8, inclusive, of these regulations, hereby removed to the extent and within the period and the limits and subject to the provisions hereinafter set out respectively, as follows:

For the purpose of defining the open seasons, for big game and game birds, the Province shall be divided into two districts, to be known as the Western and Eastern Districts and also into Game Management Areas as set out herein.

"WESTERN DISTRICT" shall mean and include all that part of the Province situate and lying to the west of the summit of the Cascade Mountains and south of the Atlin Electoral District, except that portion of the Skeena Electoral District covered by the watershed of the Bulkley and Zymagottitz Rivers, with the boundary between the outlets of said rivers to be the southern bank of the Skeena River, and that portion of the Caribou Electoral District situate and lying to the west of the summit of the Cascade Mountains.

"EASTERN DISTRICT" shall mean and include all of the remainder of the Province.

Provided, for the purpose of the open seasons on migratory game birds, that portion of the Skeena River and its watershed situate and lying within the boundaries of the Skeena Electoral District east of a line drawn north and south (astronomic) through the mouth of the Khyeex River to be construed and be considered as lying within the Eastern District.

WESTERN DISTRICT

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 1" shall mean and include the Comox, Alberni, Esquimalt, Cowichan-Newcastle, Nanaimo and the Islands, Saanich, Oak Bay, and Victoria City Electoral Districts.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 2" shall mean and include the Dewdney, North Vancouver, and Delta, Delta, Burnaby, and New Westminster Electoral Districts and that portion of the Lillooet Electoral District situate and lying within the Western District.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 3" shall mean and include that portion of the Mackenzie Electoral District situate and lying south of the 52nd parallel of north latitude.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 4" shall mean and include that portion of the Western District situate and lying north of the 52nd parallel of north latitude except all of the Queen Charlotte Islands.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 5" shall mean and include all of the Queen Charlotte Islands.

EASTERN DISTRICT

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 6" shall mean and include the Yale Electoral District except that portion bounded on the south by Highway No. 8 between Spences Bridge and Merritt, on the east side by Highway No. 5 between Merritt and Kamloops, and on the south by the Kamloops Electoral District situate and lying south of the South Thompson River and east of Highway No. 5 between Merritt and Kamloops, and the Salmon Arm Electoral District situate and lying south of the South Thompson River and Shuswap Lake.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 7A" shall mean and include the Similkameen Electoral District.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 7B" shall mean and include the South Okanagan Electoral District.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 8" shall mean and include the Grand Forks-Greenwood Electoral District.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 9" shall mean and include the North Okanagan Electoral District.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 10" shall mean and include the Rossland-Trail, Nelson-Creston, and Kaslo-Slocan Electoral Districts.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 11" shall mean and include the Columbia, Cranbrook, and Fernie Electoral Districts (except Yoho and Kootenay National Parks).

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 12" shall mean and include the Revelstoke Electoral District (except Glacier and Mount Revelstoke National Parks).

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 13" shall mean and include that portion of the Kamloops Electoral District situate and lying to the north of the South Thompson River and to the east of the North Thompson River, Clearwater River, and Shuswap Lake, and that portion of the Salmon Arm Electoral District situate and lying north of the South Thompson River and Shuswap Lake.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 14" shall mean and include those portions of the Lillooet and Caribou Electoral Districts situate and lying east of the Fraser River, south of the south shore-line of Quessnel River, Quessnel Lake, and the east arm thereof; that portion of the Bulkley Electoral District bounded on the south by Highway No. 8 between Spences Bridge and Merritt, and on the east by Highway No. 5 between Merritt and Kamloops; those portions of the Kamloops Electoral District situate and lying west of Highway No. 5 between Merritt and Kamloops, and west of the North Thompson River and Shuswap Rivers (except Game Management Area No. 17).

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 15" shall mean and include that portion of the Lillooet Electoral District situate and lying west of the Fraser River and east of the summit of the Cascade Mountains.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 16" shall mean and include that portion of the Caribou Electoral District situate and lying to the west of the Fraser River and to the south of the Chilcotin River, Chilanko River, Tatla Lake Creek, Tatla Lake, and the main highway between Tatla Lake and Bella Coola.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 17" shall mean and include that portion of the Kamloops Electoral District known as Wells Gray Provincial Park and including an area lying north of Grouse (Moul) Creek in the Upper Clearwater Valley.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 18" shall mean and include that portion of the Caribou Electoral District situate and lying to the west of the Fraser River and to the south of the Chilcotin River, Chilanko River, Tatla Lake Creek, Tatla Lake, and the main highway between Tatla Lake and Bella Coola.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 19" shall mean and include that portion of the Caribou Electoral District lying to the east of the Fraser River and to the north of the south shore-line of Quessnel River, Quessnel Lake, and the east arm thereof.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 20" shall mean and include those portions of the Fort George, Omineca, Skeena, and Atlin Electoral Districts situate and lying within the Eastern District and south of the 56th parallel of north latitude.

"GAME MANAGEMENT AREA No. 21" shall mean and include all of the Peace River Electoral District and all that part of the Province situate and lying to the north of the 56th parallel of north latitude.

PROVIDED that henceforth in these regulations the term "Game Management Area" shall be designated as "G.M.A."

All dates mentioned in these regulations are inclusive and apply unless otherwise noted, to the calendar year 1961. There is no open season on any game other than in the open districts and during the periods in these regulations.

The open seasons declared by these regulations shall cease to be in effect in any area covered

All times mentioned in these regulations refer to Pacific Standard Time unless otherwise specifically mentioned.

The electoral districts mentioned in these regulations cover such districts as constituted at the time of the passing of these regulations.

The Migratory Game Bird Seasons in these regulations are subject to confirmation by Federal Order in Council.

OPEN SEASONS, WESTERN DISTRICT BIG GAME

BEAR
GRIZZLY BEAR, September 1st, 1961, to June 30th, 1962, and on **BLACK or BROWN BEAR** there shall be no close season.

DEER
BUCKS ONLY, over one year of age, throughout the Western District, except G.M.A. No. 5, September 16th to December 3rd.

ANTLERLESS (includes DOES and all animals under one year of age), G.M.A. No. 1 (except that portion of Vancouver Island situate and lying south of the Koksikial and Salmon Rivers and in G.M.A. Nos. 2 and 3, and G.M.A. No. 4 (except the Bella Coola River watershed), November 11th to December 3rd. On that portion of Vancouver Island situate and lying south of the Koksikial and San Juan Rivers and including all of Saltspring Island November 25th to December 3rd.

G.M.A. No. 5, there shall be no close season on either sex of any age.

MOOSE
BUCKS ONLY, over one year of age, in G.M.A. Nos. 3 and 4, September 1st to December 3rd, and in G.M.A. No. 2, November 25th to December 3rd.

ANTLERLESS (includes COWS and all animals under one year of age), in G.M.A. No. 3, November 4th to December 3rd, and in G.M.A. No. 2, November 25th to December 3rd.

OVER ONE YEAR OF AGE, in G.M.A. Nos. 2 and 4, September 1st to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 3, August 15th to December 3rd.

BULLS ONLY, over one year of age, in G.M.A. No. 1, October 7th to October 22nd. In G.M.A. No. 3, September 16th to December 3rd and in G.M.A. No. 5, September 16th to November 25th.

ANTLERLESS (includes COWS and all animals under one year of age), in G.M.A. No. 3, September 16th to December 3rd, and in G.M.A. No. 5, October 14th to October 22nd. In G.M.A. No. 1, October 7th to October 22nd.

MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS

In G.M.A. Nos. 1, 3, 4 and 5, **DUCKS** (except Elder Ducks), **COOTS**, and **GEES** (except Black Brant), October 14th, 1961 to January 17th, 1962. In G.M.A. No. 2, **DUCKS** (except Elder Ducks), **COOTS** and **GEES** (except Black Brant and Snow Geese) October 14th, 1961 to January 17th, 1962.

SNOW GEES in G.M.A. No. 2, December 2nd, 1961 to February 28th, 1962.

BLACK BRANT in G.M.A. Nos. 1 to 5, inclusive, January 13th, 1962, to March 5th, 1962.

WILSON'S SNIFE in G.M.A. Nos. 1 to 5, October 14th to December 3rd.

BAND-TAILED PIGEONS throughout the Western District (except G.M.A. No. 5), September 2nd to October 15th.

PROVIDED in that portion of the Lower Mainland, known as Boundary Bay, in the Municipality of Delta, situate and lying west of a straight line drawn due south from the point of Benson Road to its intersection with the 49th parallel of north latitude, the following shall apply:

- (a) No person shall shoot or hunt Brant or use Brant decoys, or guide, or in any way assist in the hunting of Brant on more than two days, or part thereof, in succession, and in no case on more than two days in each week.
- (b) No person shall set out more than one flock of Brant decoys.
- (c) No flock of Brant decoys shall exceed fifty (50) in number.
- (d) No person shall place a flock of Brant decoys within two hundred (200) yards of any other flock of Brant decoys.
- (e) No more than one blind shall be used for each set of Brant decoys unless blinds are so constructed that they are parallel to each other, and no blind shall contain more than five (5) persons at any one time.

No person shall hunt, kill, or attempt to kill any migratory game bird during the night, which, for the purpose of these regulations, unless otherwise noted herein, means during the period ending one-half hour before sunrise and beginning the preceding evening at the following times in those portions known as the Dewdney, Chilliwack, Delta, North Vancouver, New Westminster, Vancouver-Point Grey, Vancouver East, and Burnaby Electoral Districts:

- (1) On October 14th and 15th, from one hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.
- (2) From October 16th to 31st..... 5:40 p.m.
- (3) From November 1st to 14th..... 5:15 p.m.
- (4) From November 15th to December 31st..... 5:00 p.m.
- (5) From January 1st to 14th, 1962..... 5:00 p.m.
- (6) From January 15th to 31st, 1962..... 5:00 p.m.
- (7) From February 1st to 14th, 1962..... 5:00 p.m.
- (8) From February 15th..... 6:00 p.m.

(This synopsis is for quick reference to dates only and does not constitute the complete official regulations). ("G.M.A." means game management area as set out in regulations).

and in the remaining portions of the Western District the hunting of migratory game birds shall only be allowed or permissible during the period ending one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

The possession of firearms by any person during the night in a place frequented by migratory game birds is prima facie evidence of hunting such birds during the night.

GROUSE (BLUE and FRANKLIN'S), throughout the Western District, September 2nd to November 5th.

GROUSE (RUFFED) commonly called **WILLOW**, in G.M.A. No. 1, September 2nd to December 10th; in G.M.A. Nos. 2, 3, and 4, September 2nd to November 30th.

CALIFORNIA QUAIL, on Saltspring, Denman, and Hornby Islands, and in those portions of Vancouver Island situate and lying south of the Clemansin River, October 14th to November 30th.

HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGE, no open season in any portion of the Western District.

PTARMIGAN throughout the Western District (except in G.M.A. No. 5), September 2nd to December 3rd.

PHASANTS (COCK BIRDS ONLY), throughout the Western District (except in G.M.A. No. 5), September 2nd to December 3rd.

HENS, in that portion of Vancouver Island situate and lying south of the Shawangwan Lake Cut-off Road, October 14th to November 30th.

PROVIDED that the shooting of **PHASANTS** is prohibited in the North Saanich District, on Vancouver Island, on the following days, namely: October 15th, 22nd, 29th, and November 5th, 12th, 19th, and 26th, and, further, the hunting or shooting of **PHASANTS** in the district mentioned herein and provided with an open season shall be, on each and every day during such open season, from sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.

BAG-LIMITS

OPEN SEASONS, EASTERN DISTRICT BIG GAME

BEAR
GRIZZLY BEAR, in G.M.A. No. 21, August 15th, 1961, to June 30th, 1962, and throughout the remainder of the Eastern District, September 1st, 1961, to June 30th, 1962.

BLACK or BROWN BEAR, there shall be no close season thereon, except in G.M.A. No. 12 September 16th to November 25th. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 6 lying south of the 50th parallel of latitude and in G.M.A. Nos. 7 and 7A, October 14th to October 22nd. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 11 situate and lying north of the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway and in G.M.A. No. 15, November 25th to December 3rd. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 13 situate and lying north of a line commencing at the confluence of the Clearwater and North Thompson Rivers and following the North Thompson River to McMurphy Station and thence due east to the eastern boundary of G.M.A. No. 13, November 25th to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 17, September 16th to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 20 and those portions of G.M.A. No. 21 east of the White Pass-Yukon Railway, September 1st to December 15th. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 19, September 1st to December 15th.

ANTLERLESS (includes COWS and all animals under one year of age), in that portion of G.M.A. No. 6 situate and lying north of the 50th parallel of latitude and in that portion of G.M.A. No. 14 south of the 52nd parallel of latitude, and in G.M.A. No. 13, September 1st to December 3rd. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 6 lying south of the 50th parallel of latitude and in G.M.A. Nos. 7 and 7A, October 14th to October 22nd. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 11 situate and lying north of the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway and in G.M.A. No. 15, November 25th to December 3rd. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 13 situate and lying north of a line commencing at the confluence of the Clearwater and North Thompson Rivers and following the North Thompson River to McMurphy Station and thence due east to the eastern boundary of G.M.A. No. 13, November 25th to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 17, September 16th to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 20 and those portions of G.M.A. No. 21 east of the White Pass-Yukon Railway, September 1st to December 15th. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 19, September 1st to December 15th.

WILSON'S SNIFE in G.M.A. No. 13, September 1st to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 17, September 16th to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 20 and those portions of G.M.A. No. 21 east of the White Pass-Yukon Railway, September 1st to December 15th.

MOUNTAIN-SHEEP
RAMS ONLY, over one year of age, in G.M.A. No. 11, September 1st to October 22nd. In G.M.A. No. 20 and those portions of G.M.A. No. 21 lying east of the White Pass-Yukon Railway, August 15th to November 15th. In those portions of G.M.A. No. 21 lying west of the White Pass-Yukon Railway, August 1st to November 15th.

RAMS ONLY HAVING THREE-QUARTER CURL OR BETTER, in G.M.A. Nos. 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 14, September 23rd to September 29th. In G.M.A. Nos. 15 and 16, September 1st to October 31st.

MOUNTAIN-GOAT
OVER ONE YEAR OF AGE, in those portions of G.M.A. No. 7 situate and lying south and west of the Similkameen River and east of the Ashnola River and in G.M.A. No. 8, September 23rd to September 29th. In G.M.A. No. 17, September 1st to October 31st. In G.M.A. No. 20 and those portions of G.M.A. No. 21 situate and lying east of the White Pass-Yukon Railway, August 1st to December 15th. In the remainder of the Eastern District (except those portions of G.M.A. No. 21 not provided with an open season), September 1st to December 3rd.

WAPITI (ELK)
BULLS ONLY, over one year of age, in G.M.A. Nos. 6, 7, 7A and 9, September 16th to December 3rd. In that portion of G.M.A. No. 10 described as starting at the junction or confluence of the Kootenay River and Goat River, thence along the north, east and west banks of Goat River to the mouth of Arrow Creek, thence along the north, east and west banks of Arrow Creek to its junction or confluence with Okell Creek; thence along the east bank of Arrow Creek in a north-westerly direction to its headwaters; thence in a straight line due north to the headwaters of Huggard Creek; thence along the south bank of Huggard Creek to its junction or confluence with Duck Creek; thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to a point on the Creston-Nelson Highway where it crosses Drywash Creek; thence in a straight line due west to the Kootenay River; thence southerly along the east bank of the Kootenay River to the point of commencement, September 9th to December 31st. In G.M.A. No. 11, September 9th to December 31st. In G.M.A. No. 17, September 16th to December 31st. In G.M.A. No. 19, September 16th to December 31st.

CARIBOU
BULLS ONLY, over one year of age, in G.M.A. Nos. 6, 7, 7A and 9, September 16th to December 3rd. In G.M.A. No. 10 (except that portion of the Nelson-Creston Electoral District

situate and lying west of Kootenay Lake and River and south of a straight line running due east from the mouth of the Kootenay River, December 31st. In G.M.A. No. 17, September 16th to December 31st. In G.M.A. No. 18, and that portion of G.M.A. No. 20 within the boundaries of Skeena Electoral Districts lying south of the Canadian National Railway (Jasper to Prince Rupert), September 1st to October 15th. In the remainder of G.M.A. No. 20 and all of G.M.A. No. 21 lying east of the White Pass-Yukon Railway, August 1st to December 3rd.

COWS and all animals under one year of age, in G.M.A. Nos. 6, 7, 7A and 9, September 1st to December 31st. In G.M.A. No. 10 (except that portion of the Nelson-Creston Electoral District situate and lying west of Kootenay Lake and River and south of a straight line running due east and west through Ymir), September 1st to December 31st.
