

Detailed maps may be obtained at a reasonable fee from your Government Agent or the Director, Surveys and Mapping Branch, Dept. of Lands, Forests and Water Resources, Victoria, B.C.

PERMIT TO EXPORT

Any NON-RESIDENT HUNTER, in order to export trophies secured, must obtain a permit for this purpose from any Conservation Officer or Government Agent. This permit will be issued upon payment of the fees due on trophies being exported as set forth in the regulations. Trophy fees are payable on any or all big game killed whether exported or otherwise.

The open seasons for the hunting or killing of each species and class of game shall be those set forth in Schedule I and Schedule II. All dates mentioned in the regulations and schedules thereto are inclusive.

Where seasons in Schedule I do not apply to complete Management Areas they are marked by an asterisk and the applicable seasons, with descriptions of the periods and areas involved are contained in Schedule II.

The open seasons declared by these Regulations shall cease to be in effect in any area covered by a closure order issued by the Forest Service of the Department of Lands, Forests and Water Resources and shall continue to be ineffective during the period covered by such forest closure order.

Unless otherwise indicated all dates in these regulations and the schedules thereto apply to the 1971 calendar year.

OPEN SEASONS

The open seasons for the hunting or killing of each species and class of game shall be those set forth in Schedule I and Schedule II. All dates mentioned in the regulations and schedules thereto are inclusive.

Where seasons in Schedule I do not apply to complete Management Areas they are marked by an asterisk and the applicable seasons, with descriptions of the periods and areas involved are contained in Schedule II.

The open seasons declared by these Regulations shall cease to be in effect in any area covered by a closure order issued by the Forest Service of the Department of Lands, Forests and Water Resources and shall continue to be ineffective during the period covered by such forest closure order.

Unless otherwise indicated all dates in these regulations and the schedules thereto apply to the 1971 calendar year.

SCHEDULE II

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 1

Deer. There is no open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer in those portions of M.A. No. 1 described as follows: the watershed of the south fork of the Nanaimo River;

that portion of the watershed of the Chemainus River lying to the north of the Chemainus River, including the headwaters of the Chemainus River, and east to include the watershed of Chipman Creek (Boulder Creek); and

that portion of the Gordon River watershed lying to the west of the gated access and lying within the boundaries of the Western Forest Industries Limited logging area.

Persons hunting with bow and arrow are also permitted the open season provided by Special Regulation.

Partridge. There shall be no open season on Ptarmigan south of Parksville-Alberni Highway (Highway No. 4).

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 2
Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 2 east of the Fraser River and north of Highway No. 3 the open season on Bull Moose is September 12 to September 20.

Mountain Goat. There is no open season on Mountain Goat in that portion of M.A. No. 2 lying south and east of the Fraser River.

Partridge. There is no open season on Partridge in that portion of M.A. No. 2 lying north of the 50th parallel of latitude and in that portion of the lower Fraser Valley lying east of the Municipalities of Langley and Maple Ridge.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 3
Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 3 known as Texada Island the open season for Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is November 13 to November 28; in the remainder of M.A. No. 3, no open season.

Persons hunting with bow and arrow are also permitted the open season provided by Special Regulation.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 4
Mountain Goat. In that portion of M.A. No. 3 known as Goat Island in Powell Lake, no open season.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 5
Partridge. The hunting of Partridge, Hungarian. The hunting of Partridge, Hungarian is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

HUNTING REGULATIONS, 1971-72

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 6

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. No. 6 east of Okanagan Lake and River the open season on Mountain Sheep Rams, 3/4 curl is September 25 to October 2.

Partridge. The hunting of Partridge, Hungarian is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Quail. The hunting of Quail is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 7
Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 7 lying within the Larcen Creek, Paul Creek and Ashnola River drainages; and that portion lying south and west of the Similkameen River from the confluence of the Ashnola River to the International Border, the open season on Buck Mule (Blacktail) and Buck Whitetail Deer shall be September 4 to December 5 and for Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) and Antlerless Whitetail Deer shall be October 30 to November 28.

Partridge. The hunting of Partridge is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 8
Whitetail Deer. In M.A. 8 the open season for Buck Whitetail Deer is September 4 to October 17 and November 20 to December 12.

Mountain Goat. There is no open season on Mountain Goat in that portion of M.A. No. 8 lying within the Lynch Creek and Morrell Creek watersheds.

Partridge. The hunting of Partridge is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 9
Whitetail Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 9 lying within the watershed of the Kootenay River between the Fort Steele Bridge and the International Boundary, the open season for Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is November 11 to November 21.

Whitetail Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 10 comprised of the watershed of Kootenay Lake and River above South Sloca, the open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is October 23 to December 5.

Whitetail Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 10 comprised of the watershed of Kootenay Lake and River above South Sloca, the open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is October 23 to December 5.

Elk. In that portion of M.A. No. 10 comprised of the watershed of Kootenay Lake and River above South Sloca, the open season on Bull Elk is September 4 to November 28 and on Antlerless Elk is October 30 to November 28. In the remainder of M.A. No. 10 there is no open season.

Caribou. There is no open season on any Caribou in that portion of M.A. No. 10 lying to the east of the Columbia River, to the south of the Kootenay River and West Arm of Kootenay Lake and to the west of the South Arm of Kootenay Lake and the Kootenay River.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 11
Mule Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 11 comprised of the watershed of the Kootenay River between the Fort Steele Bridge and the International Boundary, the open season for Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is November 11 to November 21.

Whitetail Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 11 comprised of the watershed of the Kootenay River between the Fort Steele Bridge and the International Boundary, the open season on Antlerless Whitetail Deer is November 11 to November 21.

Elk. In that portion of M.A. No. 11 comprised of the watershed of the Elk River north of Highway No. 3 there is no open season on any Moose.

Mountain Goat. The open season on Mountain Goat, males only, is September 4 to October 31. There is no season on any Mountain Goat in the Moyie River and Stoddart Creek watersheds and the watershed of the Elk River north of Crownstee Pass and east of the Elk River.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 13
Moose. In those portions of M.A. No. 13 in the Adams River watershed upstream from Adams Lake and the North Thompson River watershed upstream from the confluence of the Clearwater and North Thompson Rivers, the season for Antlerless Moose, October 23 to December 12.

Partridge. The hunting of Partridge is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 14
Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 14 comprising the watershed of the North Thompson River the open season for Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) and Antlerless Whitetail Deer is October 23 to November 21.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. No. 14 east of the junction of the Bonaparte and Thompson Rivers the open season for Mountain Sheep Rams is September 16.

Partridge. The hunting of Partridge is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 15
Partridge. The hunting of Partridge is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Quail. The hunting of Quail is permitted from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 20
MOUNT ROBSON PARK SPECIAL AREA. In that portion of M.A. No. 20 known as Mount Robson Park the season for the following species is:
Deer. The open season on Buck Mule (Blacktail) and Buck Whitetail Deer is September 11 to November 21.

Whitetail Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 10 comprised of the watershed of Kootenay Lake and River above South Sloca, the open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is October 23 to December 5.

Whitetail Deer. In that portion of M.A. No. 10 comprised of the watershed of Kootenay Lake and River above South Sloca, the open season on Antlerless Mule (Blacktail) Deer is October 23 to December 5.

Elk. In that portion of M.A. No. 10 comprised of the watershed of Kootenay Lake and River above South Sloca, the open season on Bull Elk is September 4 to November 28 and on Antlerless Elk is October 30 to November 28. In the remainder of M.A. No. 10 there is no open season.

Caribou. There is no open season on any Caribou in that portion of M.A. No. 10 lying to the east of the Columbia River, to the south of the Kootenay River and West Arm of Kootenay Lake and to the west of the South Arm of Kootenay Lake and the Kootenay River.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 21
Moose. In that portion of M.A. No. 21 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Bull Moose is August 14 to November 28.

Mountain Goat. In that portion of M.A. No. 21 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Mountain Goat is August 1 to November 15.

Caribou. In that portion of M.A. No. 21 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude the open season on Bull Caribou is August 1 to November 28.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. No. 21 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Mountain Sheep Rams 3/4 curl is August 1 to October 17.

Partridge. In that portion of M.A. No. 21 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Ptarmigan is August 1 to November 28.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 23
Bear. In M.A. No. 23 there is no open season on White or Kermodei Bear.

MANAGEMENT AREA No. 25

Moose. In that portion of M.A. No. 25 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Bull Moose is August 14 to November 28.

Mountain Goat. In that portion of M.A. No. 25 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Mountain Goat is August 1 to November 15.

Caribou. In that portion of M.A. No. 25 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Bull Caribou is August 1 to November 28.

Mountain Sheep. In that portion of M.A. No. 25 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Mountain Sheep Rams 3/4 curl is August 1 to October 17.

Bear. In M.A. No. 25 there is no open season on White or Kermodei Bear.

Ptarmigan. In that portion of M.A. No. 25 lying north of 56 degrees north latitude, the open season on Ptarmigan is August 1 to November 28.

BOW AND ARROW SEASONS

It is legal to hunt with a bow and arrow during any open season in any area that is open to hunting with firearms. The licence requirements and bag and possession limits are the same as those that apply to firearms hunters. Bag and possession limits on game species in the following bow seasons, are not additions to the general bag and possession limits.

In addition to the regular seasons the following extensions apply to the use of Bow and Arrow ONLY!

FIREARMS RESTRICTIONS

Most Municipalities have local by-laws restricting or controlling the use of firearms within their boundaries. Hunters are advised to consult Municipal Clerks for details of closures.

The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the following areas:

(h) In that portion of M.A. No. 1 known as Protection Island.
(i) In that portion of M.A. No. 2 known as the George C. Rieffel Waterfowl Refuge.
(j) In that portion of M.A. No. 2 known as Provincial Gaol Camp No. 1.
(k) In that portion of M.A. No. 6 known as the Kelowna Closed Area.
(l) In that portion of M.A. No. 6 known as the Brenda Mines Closed Area.
(m) In that portion of M.A. No. 6 known as the Swan Lake Closed Area.
(n) In that portion of M.A. No. 7 known as the Similkameen Mining Co. Closed Area.
(o) In that portion of M.A. No. 7 known as the Upper Similkameen River Closed Area.
(p) In that portion of M.A. No. 9 known as Mica Creek Closed Area.
(q) In that portion of M.A. No. 11 known as Fording Mountain Closed Area.
(r) In that portion of M.A. No. 11 known as Fording Coal Closed Area.
(s) In that portion of M.A. No. 11 known as Kaiser Resources Closed Area.

(u) In that portion of M.A. Nos. 13, 14 and 15 known as Kamloops Closed Area.
(v) In that portion of M.A. No. 14 known as the Tranquille Closed Area.
(w) In that portion of M.A. No. 15 known as the Salmon Arm Closed Area.
(x) In that portion of M.A. No. 15 known as the Sicamous Closed Area.
(y) In that portion of M.A. No. 15 known as the Minnie Lake Closed Area.
(z) In that portion of M.A. No. 17 known as the Ocean Falls Closed Area.
(aa) In that portion of M.A. No. 24 known as the Port Clements Closed Area.
(ab) In that portion of M.A. No. 25 known as the Kathly Lake Closed Area.
(ac) In that portion of M.A. No. 28 known as the Charlie Lake Closed Area.

The above descriptions are abbreviated and hunters are advised to contact the local authorities for specific details.

PARK RESTRICTIONS

These hunting regulations do not apply in National Parks. Hunting and/or the discharge of firearms is not permitted in any Provincial Class C Park nor in the majority of Class A or B Parks.

MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS

Regulations will be published on a separate sheet by the Canadian Wildlife Service and will be available from hunting-licence issuers.

Hunters are reminded that in addition to the required Provincial licence a Canada Migratory Game Bird Hunting Permit is required when hunting migratory game birds.

LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

ANY PERSON OF ANY AGE must take out a hunting licence if he hunts wildlife in British Columbia. There is no special fee for young people. In addition, a person under 18 must submit an acknowledgement of responsibility signed by a parent or guardian before obtaining a hunting licence. A person under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a person 20 or over when carrying a firearm.

TAG LICENCE FEES

- BIG-GAME TAG-LICENCES:
Persons hunting big game are required to take out the proper tag-licences for the desired species before they start hunting.

Any person who kills any of the above big game species, must immediately cancel the appropriate tag-licence.
The possession of a big game animal without a properly cancelled tag-licence is illegal.
Cancelled tag-licence means one from which the portions bearing the month and the day of the month have been removed by the hunter, to indicate the date the animal was killed.
The cancelled tag-licence must accompany the carcass until the carcass is at the place of consumption.

ALL LICENCES EXPIRE MARCH 31

NOTICE TO NON-RESIDENT BIG GAME HUNTERS

NON-RESIDENTS of the Province hunting big game, except coyote, must be accompanied by a licensed British Columbia guide. On the completion of the hunt non-residents must have a form of declaration. Failure to do so constitutes an offense on the part of both hunter and guide.

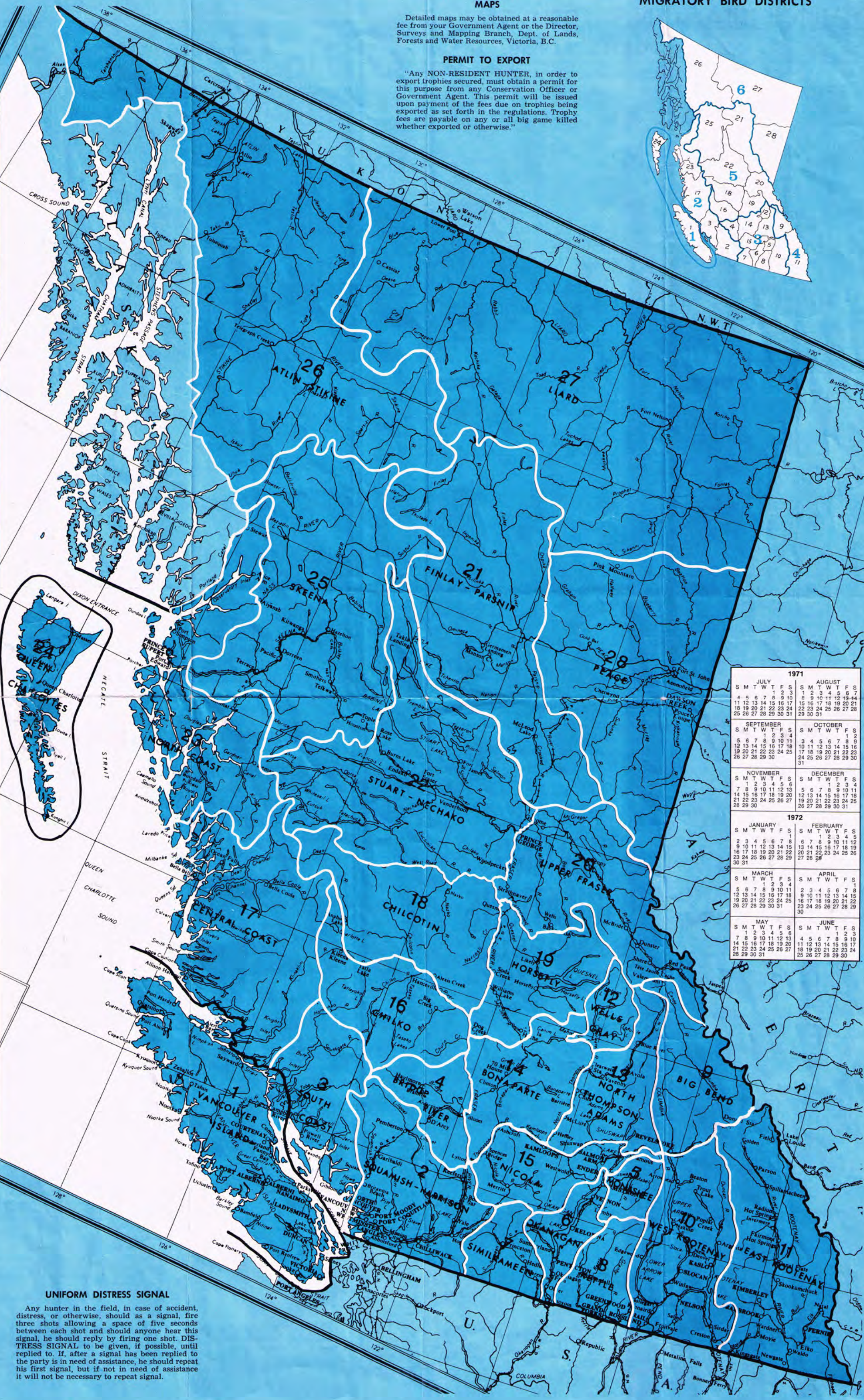
TROPHY FEES

All non-resident sportsmen are required to pay fees on any big-game animal they kill, whether or not the animal is taken from the hunting-ground.

BE A SPORTSMAN IT IS UNLAWFUL

- To use any swivel, set gun, machine gun, or any gun larger than a 10-gauge, or a pump or automatic shotgun without a plug - magazine to hold two shells.
To hunt any game between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or during the prohibited time or period mentioned in the Game Regulations.
To carry loaded firearms in or on a discharge case from an automobile, snowmobile or other vehicle either on or off a highway.
To have in possession, place, or set position for the taking or killing of any game.
To use pit-lamps or light of any description at any time for the purpose of hunting game.
To hunt game from any aircraft.
To use any other persons' licence or permit, or to loan or transfer any licence or permit under any circumstances.
To remove all evidence of sex from any member of the deer family or mountain sheep EXCEPT:
(a) at the place where the carcass is to be consumed; or
(b) during the open season on both sexes.
To angle for fish in non-tidal waters without a licence.
To take badger, beaver, fisher, marten, mink, muskrat, otter, squirrel or weasel unless you are the holder of a trapper's licence.
To discharge, dump, discard or dispose of litter on any land or fresh water.

UNIFORM DISTRESS SIGNAL

Any hunter in the field, in case of accident, distress, or otherwise, should as a signal, fire three shots allowing a space of five seconds between each shot and should anyone hear this signal, he should reply by firing one shot. DISTRESS SIGNAL to be given, if possible, until replied to. If, after a signal has been replied to the party is in need of assistance, he should repeat his first signal, but if not in need of assistance it will not be necessary to repeat signal.

BAG LIMITS

Bag limits for M.A.'s are set forth in Schedule III.

In Schedule III, the unbracketed number indicates the total number of animals of that species that may be taken in a given M.A., while the number in brackets designates the number of antlerless animals which may be taken.

Where special restrictions exist as to species, sex or age, they are marked by an asterisk and the applicable restriction is set forth in Schedule IV.

Where no bag limit is in effect, it is abbreviated NBL in Schedule III.

MIGRATORY BIRDS BAG LIMITS

Table with columns: Limits, Ducks, Geese, Snipe, Coots & Ralls, Sand-billed Pigeons, Mourning Doves, Black Brant.

SEASON BAG LIMITS

Table with columns: Deer (Mule and White-tailed), Moose, Elk, Goat, Caribou, Sheep, Grizzly, Black Bear, Cougar, Wolf, Coyote, Raccoon, Skunk, Bobcat, Fish, Wolverine, Lynx.

Deer. No persons shall take in the aggregate more than two (2) deer in the Province, except in M.A.'s No. 1 and 9 where there is no bag limit.

Mountain Sheep. In all M.A.'s with an open season males must be 3/4 curl or larger.

Black Bear. In M.A.'s 13 to 15 no bag limit.

Cougar. In M.A.'s 12 to 15 no bag limit.

Wolf. In M.A.'s 2 to 4 and 26 to 28 no bag limit.

NOTICE TO SPORTSMEN

The Fish & Wildlife Branch may be introducing in 1972 a quota system for hunting Goats, Grizzly Bear and Mountain Sheep in parts of some M.A.'s.

The Fish & Wildlife Branch may be further restricting Grizzly hunting seasons in 1972.

Commencing April 1, 1972, it will be mandatory for all resident hunters:

- (a) between the ages of 14 and 18; and
(b) all first time hunters 18 years of age or older; to have successfully completed the Fish & Wildlife Branch's Hunter Training, Conservation and Outdoor Safety examination BEFORE applying for a licence.

The Fish & Wildlife Branch may introduce during 1972 a licence to carry firearms.

SPRING BEAR SEASONS 1972

Black Bear. In M.A.'s 1 to 4 and 20 to 28 - April 1 - May 31. In M.A.'s 5, 9 to 19 - April 1 - June 15. In M.A.'s 10 to 18 - April 1 - August 31. There is no open season on White Kermodee Bear.

Grizzly Bear. To be announced.

Central Interior Moose hunters are requested to turn in their moose jaws at Cache Creek Checking Station.

The Fish & Wildlife Branch will be operating numerous Checking Stations throughout the Province. Hunters are requested to stop at all stations and report.

Report any tagged bird or animal to the Fish & Wildlife Branch, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B.C.
